A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters Grant Program; creating s. 1002.996, F.S.; creating the Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY) Grant Program; providing the purpose of the program; providing definitions; requiring the Florida HIPPY Training and Technical Assistance Center at the University of South Florida, subject to legislative appropriation, to provide grants to program operators establishing a HIPPY program and with an existing HIPPY program; providing the duties of the center; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1002.996, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

1002.996 The Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters Grant Program.—

- (1) PURPOSE.—Subject to legislative appropriation, the Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY) Grant Program is established to fund HIPPY programs throughout the state to support the development and operation of such programs, which help empower parents to be their child's first and most important teacher by equipping them with the tools, skills, and confidence needed to educate their children at home.
 - (2) DEFINITIONS.—
 - (a) "Center" means the Florida HIPPY Training and Technical

Assistance Center at the University of South Florida.

- (b) "HIPPY program" means an evidence-based home visitation program that supports parents in their critical role as their child's first and most important teacher. The program is created by the national nonprofit organization HIPPY USA and administered to communities at a local level.
- (c) "Program operator" means an organization that has an existing HIPPY program or is establishing a HIPPY program.
 - (3) GRANT PROGRAM.—
- (a) Subject to legislative appropriation, the center shall provide grants to program operators to fund HIPPY programs in Florida counties, including, but not limited to, Alachua, Bradford, Brevard, Broward, Duval, Gadsden, Gulf, Hillsborough, Manatee, Marion, Miami-Dade, Palm Beach, Pasco, Pinellas, and Sarasota Counties.
 - (b) The center shall:
- 1. Create and administer an application process for program operators to apply for a grant pursuant to this section.
- 2. Prioritize awards based on a program operator's demonstration of the technical and financial ability to sustain a HIPPY program beyond an initial grant award.
 - (c) To receive a grant pursuant to this section:
- 1. If a program operator is establishing a HIPPY program, the operator must successfully complete the HIPPY USA application process and meet the requirements of HIPPY USA and the center; or
- 2. If a program operator has an existing HIPPY program, the operator must provide evidence that such program meets the requirements of HIPPY USA and the center.

(4) REPORTING.—Beginning September 1, 2021, and annually thereafter, the center shall publish on its website information about each program operator receiving a grant from the center to establish or operate a HIPPY program. The information must include:

- (a) The amount of grant funds provided by the center and the amount of additional funds the program operator receives from other sources.
- (b) A description of the services and family engagement activities provided through the HIPPY program.
- (c) The number of children and families served through the HIPPY program.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
