71 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

73 Section 1. Effective July 1, 2021, paragraphs (b) and (c)  
74 of subsection (1) of section 320.06, Florida Statutes, are  
75 amended to read:

76 320.06 Registration certificates, license plates, and  
77 validation stickers generally.—

78 (1)

79 (b)1. Registration license plates bearing a graphic symbol  
80 and the alphanumeric system of identification shall be issued  
81 for a 10-year period. At the end of the 10-year period, upon  
82 renewal, the plate shall be replaced. The department shall  
83 extend the scheduled license plate replacement date from a 6-  
84 year period to a 10-year period. The fee for such replacement is  
85 \$28, \$2.80 of which shall be paid each year before the plate is  
86 replaced, to be credited toward the next \$28 replacement fee.  
87 The fees shall be deposited into the Highway Safety Operating  
88 Trust Fund. A credit or refund may not be given for any prior  
89 years' payments of the prorated replacement fee if the plate is  
90 replaced or surrendered before the end of the 10-year period,  
91 except that a credit may be given if a registrant is required by  
92 the department to replace a license plate under s.

93 320.08056(8)(a). With each license plate, a validation sticker  
94 shall be issued showing the owner's birth month, license plate  
95 number, and the year of expiration or the appropriate renewal  
96 period if the owner is not a natural person. The validation  
97 sticker shall be placed on the upper right corner of the license  
98 plate. The license plate and validation sticker shall be issued  
99 based on the applicant's appropriate renewal period. The  
100 registration period is 12 months, the extended registration

101 | period is 24 months, and all expirations occur based on the  
102 | applicant's appropriate registration period. Vehicles taxed  
103 | pursuant to s. 320.08(6)(a) may elect a permanent registration  
104 | period, provided payment of the appropriate license taxes and  
105 | fees occurs annually. A vehicle that has an apportioned  
106 | registration shall be issued an annual license plate and a cab  
107 | card that denote the declared gross vehicle weight for each  
108 | apportioned jurisdiction in which the vehicle is authorized to  
109 | operate.

110 |         2. In order to retain the efficient administration of the  
111 | taxes and fees imposed by this chapter, the 80-cent fee increase  
112 | in the replacement fee imposed by chapter 2009-71, Laws of  
113 | Florida, is negated as provided in s. 320.0804.

114 |         (c) Registration license plates equipped with validation  
115 | stickers subject to the registration period are valid for not  
116 | more than 12 months and expire at midnight on the last day of  
117 | the registration period. A registration license plate equipped  
118 | with a validation sticker subject to the extended registration  
119 | period is valid for not more than 24 months and expires at  
120 | midnight on the last day of the extended registration period. A  
121 | registration license plate equipped with a validation sticker  
122 | subject to a permanent registration period is permanently valid  
123 | but shall become void if appropriate license taxes and fees are  
124 | not paid annually. For each registration period after the one in  
125 | which the metal registration license plate is issued, and until

126 the license plate is required to be replaced, a validation  
127 sticker showing the month and year of expiration shall be issued  
128 upon payment of the proper license tax amount and fees and is  
129 valid for not more than 12 months. For each extended  
130 registration period occurring after the one in which the metal  
131 registration license plate is issued and until the license plate  
132 is required to be replaced, a validation sticker showing the  
133 year of expiration shall be issued upon payment of the proper  
134 license tax amount and fees and is valid for not more than 24  
135 months. For each permanent registration period occurring after  
136 the one in which the metal registration license plate is issued  
137 and until the license plate is required to be replaced, a  
138 validation sticker showing a permanent registration period shall  
139 be issued upon payment of the proper license tax amount and fees  
140 and is permanently valid but shall become void if the proper  
141 license taxes and fees are not paid annually. When license  
142 plates equipped with validation stickers are issued in any month  
143 other than the owner's birth month or the designated  
144 registration period for any other motor vehicle, the effective  
145 date shall reflect the birth month or month and the year of  
146 renewal. However, when a license plate or validation sticker is  
147 issued for a period of less than 12 months, the applicant shall  
148 pay the appropriate amount of license tax and the applicable fee  
149 under s. 320.14 in addition to all other fees. Validation  
150 stickers issued for vehicles taxed under s. 320.08(6)(a), for

151 any company that owns 250 vehicles or more, or for semitrailers  
152 taxed under the provisions of s. 320.08(5)(a), for any company  
153 that owns 50 vehicles or more, may be placed on any vehicle in  
154 the fleet so long as the vehicle receiving the validation  
155 sticker has the same owner's name and address as the vehicle to  
156 which the validation sticker was originally assigned.

157 Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section  
158 320.06, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

159 320.06 Registration certificates, license plates, and  
160 validation stickers generally.—

161 (3)(a) Registration license plates must be made of metal  
162 specially treated with a retroreflection material, as specified  
163 by the department. The registration license plate is designed to  
164 increase nighttime visibility and legibility and must be at  
165 least 6 inches wide and not less than 12 inches in length,  
166 unless a plate with reduced dimensions is deemed necessary by  
167 the department to accommodate motorcycles, mopeds, or similar  
168 smaller vehicles. Validation stickers must also be treated with  
169 a retroreflection material, must be of such size as specified by  
170 the department, and must adhere to the license plate. The  
171 registration license plate must be imprinted with a combination  
172 of bold letters and numerals or numerals, not to exceed seven  
173 digits, to identify the registration license plate number. The  
174 license plate must be imprinted with the word "Florida" at the  
175 top and the name of the county in which it is sold, the state

176 motto, or the words "Sunshine State" at the bottom. Apportioned  
177 license plates must have the word "Apportioned" at the bottom  
178 and license plates issued for vehicles taxed under s.  
179 320.08(3)(d), (4)(m) or (n), (5)(b) or (c), or (14) must have  
180 the word "Restricted" at the bottom. License plates issued for  
181 vehicles taxed under s. 320.08(12) must be imprinted with the  
182 word "Florida" at the top and the word "Dealer" at the bottom  
183 unless the license plate is a specialty license plate as  
184 authorized in s. 320.08056. Manufacturer license plates issued  
185 for vehicles taxed under s. 320.08(12) must be imprinted with  
186 the word "Florida" at the top and the word "Manufacturer" at the  
187 bottom. License plates issued for vehicles taxed under s.  
188 320.08(5)(d) or (e) must be imprinted with the word "Wrecker" at  
189 the bottom. Any county may, upon majority vote of the county  
190 commission, elect to have the county name removed from the  
191 license plates sold in that county. The state motto or the words  
192 "Sunshine State" shall be printed in lieu thereof. A license  
193 plate issued for a vehicle taxed under s. 320.08(6) may not be  
194 assigned a registration license number, or be issued with any  
195 other distinctive character or designation, that distinguishes  
196 the motor vehicle as a for-hire motor vehicle.

197 Section 3. Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section  
198 320.0657, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

199 320.0657 Permanent registration; fleet license plates.—

201 (b) The plates, which shall be of a distinctive color,  
202 shall have the word "Fleet" appearing at the bottom and the word  
203 "Florida" appearing at the top unless the license plate is a  
204 specialty license plate as authorized in s. 320.08056. The  
205 plates shall conform in all respects to the provisions of this  
206 chapter, except as specified herein. For additional fees as set  
207 forth in s. 320.08056, fleet companies may purchase specialty  
208 license plates in lieu of the standard fleet license plates.  
209 Fleet companies shall be responsible for all costs associated  
210 with the specialty license plate, including all annual use fees,  
211 processing fees, fees associated with switching license plate  
212 types, and any other applicable fees.

213 Section 4. Subsection (12) of section 320.08, Florida  
214 Statutes, is amended to read:

215 320.08 License taxes.—Except as otherwise provided herein,  
216 there are hereby levied and imposed annual license taxes for the  
217 operation of motor vehicles, mopeds, motorized bicycles as  
218 defined in s. 316.003(4), tri-vehicles as defined in s. 316.003,  
219 and mobile homes as defined in s. 320.01, which shall be paid to  
220 and collected by the department or its agent upon the  
221 registration or renewal of registration of the following:

222 (12) DEALER AND MANUFACTURER LICENSE PLATES.—A franchised  
223 motor vehicle dealer, independent motor vehicle dealer, marine  
224 boat trailer dealer, or mobile home dealer and manufacturer  
225 license plate: \$17 flat. For additional fees as set forth in s.

226 320.08056, dealers may purchase specialty license plates in lieu  
227 of the standard dealer license plates. Dealers shall be  
228 responsible for all costs associated with the specialty license  
229 plate, including all annual use fees, processing fees, fees  
230 associated with switching license plate types, and any other  
231 applicable fees.

232 Section 5. Section 320.08053, Florida Statutes, is amended  
233 to read:

234 320.08053 Establishment of Requirements for requests to  
235 establish specialty license plates.—

236 (1) If a specialty license plate requested by an  
237 organization is approved by law, the organization must submit  
238 the proposed art design for the specialty license plate to the  
239 department, in a medium prescribed by the department, as soon as  
240 practicable, but no later than 60 days after the act approving  
241 the specialty license plate becomes a law.

242 (2)(a) Within 120 days after ~~following~~ the specialty  
243 license plate becomes ~~becoming~~ law, the department shall  
244 establish a method to issue a specialty license plate voucher to  
245 allow for the presale of the specialty license plate. The  
246 processing fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056, the service charge  
247 and branch fee as prescribed in s. 320.04, and the annual use  
248 fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056 shall be charged for the  
249 voucher. All other applicable fees shall be charged at the time  
250 of issuance of the license plates.

251 (b) Within 24 months after the presale specialty license  
252 plate voucher is established, the approved specialty license  
253 plate organization must record with the department a minimum of  
254 3,000 ~~1,000~~ voucher sales, or in the case of an out-of-state  
255 college or university license plate, 4,000 voucher sales, before  
256 manufacture of the license plate may commence. If, at the  
257 conclusion of the 24-month presale period, the minimum sales  
258 requirement has ~~requirements have~~ not been met, the specialty  
259 plate is deauthorized and the department shall discontinue  
260 development of the plate and discontinue issuance of the presale  
261 vouchers. Upon deauthorization of the license plate, a purchaser  
262 of the license plate voucher may use the annual use fee  
263 collected as a credit towards any other specialty license plate  
264 or apply for a refund on a form prescribed by the department.

265 (3) (a) New specialty license plates that have been  
266 approved by law but are awaiting issuance under paragraph (b)  
267 shall be issued in the order they appear in s. 320.08058  
268 provided that they have met the presale requirement. All other  
269 provisions of this section must also be met before a specialty  
270 license plate may be issued. If the next awaiting specialty  
271 license plate has not met the presale requirement, the  
272 department shall proceed in the order provided in s. 320.08058  
273 to identify the next qualified specialty license plate that has  
274 met the presale requirement. The department shall cycle through  
275 the list in statutory order.

276 (b) If the Legislature has approved 150 or more specialty  
277 license plates, the department may not make any new specialty  
278 license plates available for design or issuance until a  
279 sufficient number of plates are discontinued pursuant to s.  
280 320.08056(8) such that the number of plates being issued does  
281 not exceed 150. Notwithstanding s. 320.08056(8) (a), the 150-  
282 license-plate limit includes license plates above the minimum  
283 sales threshold and those exempt from that threshold.

284 Section 6. Present subsection (12) of section 320.08056,  
285 Florida Statutes, is renumbered as subsection (15), subsections  
286 (2) and (4), paragraph (a) of subsection (10), and subsection  
287 (11) are amended, paragraphs (c) through (f) are added to  
288 subsection (8), and new subsections (12), (13), and (14) are  
289 added to that section, to read:

290 320.08056 Specialty license plates.—

291 (2) (a) The department shall issue a specialty license  
292 plate to the owner or lessee of any motor vehicle, except a  
293 vehicle registered under the International Registration Plan, a  
294 commercial truck required to display two license plates pursuant  
295 to s. 320.0706, or a truck tractor, upon request and payment of  
296 the appropriate license tax and fees.

297 (b) The department may authorize dealer and fleet  
298 specialty license plates. With the permission of the sponsoring  
299 specialty license plate organization, a dealer or fleet company  
300 may purchase specialty license plates to be used on dealer and

301 fleet vehicles.

302 (c) Notwithstanding s. 320.08058, a dealer or fleet  
 303 specialty license plate must include the letters "DLR" or "FLT"  
 304 on the right side of the license plate. Dealer and fleet  
 305 specialty license plates must be ordered directly from the  
 306 department.

307 (4) The following license plate annual use fees shall be

403 (c) A vehicle owner or lessee issued a specialty license  
 404 plate that has been discontinued by the department may keep the  
 405 discontinued specialty license plate for the remainder of the  
 406 10-year license plate replacement period and must pay all other  
 407 applicable registration fees. However, such owner or lessee is  
 408 exempt from paying the applicable specialty license plate annual  
 409 use fee under paragraph (3) (d) or subsection (4) for the  
 410 remainder of the 10-year license plate replacement period.

411 (d) If the department discontinues issuance of a specialty  
 412 license plate, all annual use fees held or collected by the  
 413 department shall be distributed within 180 days after the date  
 414 the specialty license plate is discontinued. Of those fees, the  
 415 department shall retain an amount sufficient to defray the  
 416 applicable administrative and inventory closeout costs  
 417 associated with discontinuance of the plate. All remaining  
 418 proceeds shall be distributed to the appropriate organization or  
 419 organizations pursuant to s. 320.08058.

420 (e) If an organization that is the intended recipient of  
 421 the funds pursuant to s. 320.08058 no longer exists, the  
 422 department shall deposit any undisbursed proceeds into the  
 423 Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund.

424 (f) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), on January 1 of each  
 425 year, the department shall discontinue the specialty license

426 plate with the fewest number of plates in circulation, including  
427 license plates exempt from a statutory sales requirement. The  
428 department shall mail a warning letter to the sponsoring  
429 organizations of the 10 percent of specialty license plates with  
430 the lowest number of valid, active registrations as of December  
431 1 of each year.

432 (10) (a) A specialty license plate annual use fee collected  
433 and distributed under this chapter, or any interest earned from  
434 those fees, may not be used for commercial or for-profit  
435 activities nor for general or administrative expenses, except as  
436 authorized by s. 320.08058 or to pay the cost of the audit or  
437 report required by s. 320.08062(1). The fees and any interest  
438 earned from the fees may be expended only for use in this state  
439 unless the annual use fee is derived from the sale of United  
440 States Armed Forces and veterans-related specialty license  
441 plates pursuant to paragraph (3) (d) for the Support Our Troops  
442 and American Legion license plates; paragraphs (4) (b), (q), and

867 (a) The department shall develop a Walt Disney World  
868 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The  
869 plate must bear the colors and design approved by the  
870 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the  
871 plate, and the words "Walt Disney World" must appear at the  
872 bottom of the plate.

873 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall  
874 be distributed to the Make-A-Wish Foundation of Central and  
875 Northern Florida, Inc., a nonprofit organization under s.

876 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Up to 10 percent of the  
877 proceeds from the sale of such plates may be used for
