1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to Holocaust education; amending s. 3 1003.42, F.S.; including the study of a specified 4 policy against anti-Semitism in specified instruction; 5 providing school district and Department of Education 6 requirements relating to such instruction; authorizing 7 the department to work with certain entities for 8 specified purposes relating to required instruction; 9 providing an effective date. 10 11

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (g) of subsection (2) of section 1003.42, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1003.42 Required instruction.-

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- Members of the instructional staff of the public schools, subject to the rules of the State Board of Education and the district school board, shall teach efficiently and faithfully, using the books and materials required that meet the highest standards for professionalism and historical accuracy, following the prescribed courses of study, and employing approved methods of instruction, the following:
- The history of the Holocaust (1933-1945), the systematic, planned annihilation of European Jews and other groups by Nazi Germany, a watershed event in the history of

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humanity, to be taught in a manner that leads to an investigation of human behavior, an understanding of the ramifications of prejudice, racism, and stereotyping, and an examination of what it means to be a responsible and respectful person, for the purposes of encouraging tolerance of diversity in a pluralistic society and for nurturing and protecting democratic values and institutions, including the policy against anti-Semitism, as described in s. 1000.05(7). Each school district must annually certify and provide evidence to the department, in a manner prescribed by the department, that the requirements of this paragraph are met. The department shall prepare and offer curriculum standards for the instruction required by this paragraph and may work with the Commissioner of Education's Task Force on Holocaust Education, the Florida Holocaust Museum, and other state or nationally recognized Holocaust educational organizations to develop grade-appropriate curricula, training for instructional personnel, and classroom resources for the instruction required by this paragraph. The State Board of Education is encouraged to adopt standards and pursue assessment of the requirements of this subsection. A character development program that incorporates the values of the recipients of the Congressional Medal of Honor and that is offered as part of a social studies, English Language Arts, or other schoolwide character building and veteran awareness
