The Commissioner of Education's African 39 American History Task Force is directed to examine ways in which 40 the history of the 1920 Ocoee Election Day Riots will be 41 included in instruction on African-American history required 42 pursuant to s. 1003.42(2)(h), Florida Statutes. The task force 43 shall submit its recommendations to the Commissioner of 44 Education and the State Board of Education by March 1, 2021. 45 Section 2. The Secretary of State is directed to: 46 (1) In coordination with the Division of Cultural Affairs 47 of the Department of State, determine how the Museum of Florida 48 History and other state museums will promote the history of the 49 1920 Ocoee Election Day Riots through exhibits and educational 50 programs.

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(2) 51 Collaborate with the National Museum of African 52 American History and Culture of the Smithsonian Institution to 53 seek inclusion of the history of the 1920 Ocoee Election Day 54 Riots in the museum's exhibits. 55 Section 3. The Secretary of Environmental Protection is 56 directed to determine which state park, or a portion of or a 57 facility therein, will be named in recognition of any victim of 58 the 1920 Ocoee Election Day Riots. The secretary may appoint a 59 committee to assess naming opportunities. If a change to state 60 law is required in order to change the designation of a state park, or a portion of or a facility therein, the secretary shall 61 62 submit any such recommendation to the President of the Senate 63 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. 64 Section 4. District school boards are encouraged to assess 65 opportunities for naming school facilities in recognition of 66 victims of the 1920 Ocoee Election Day Riots. 67 Section 5. Paragraph (q) of subsection (2) of section 68 1003.42, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 69 1003.42 Required instruction.-70 (2) Members of the instructional staff of the public 71 schools, subject to the rules of the State Board of Education 72 and the district school board, shall teach efficiently and faithfully, using the books and materials required that meet the 73 74 highest standards for professionalism and historical accuracy, 75 following the prescribed courses of study, and employing

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76 approved methods of instruction, the following: 77 The history of the Holocaust (1933-1945), the (q)1. 78 systematic, planned annihilation of European Jews and other 79 groups by Nazi Germany, a watershed event in the history of 80 humanity, to be taught in a manner that leads to an 81 investigation of human behavior, an understanding of the 82 ramifications of prejudice, racism, and stereotyping, and an 83 examination of what it means to be a responsible and respectful person, for the purposes of encouraging tolerance of diversity 84 85 in a pluralistic society and for nurturing and protecting 86 democratic values and institutions, including the policy, 87 definition, and historical and current examples of anti-Semitism, as described in s. 1000.05(7), and the prevention of 88 89 anti-Semitism. Each school district must annually certify and 90 provide evidence to the department, in a manner prescribed by 91 the department, that the requirements of this paragraph are met. 92 The department shall prepare and offer standards and curriculum 93 for the instruction required by this paragraph and may seek 94 input from the Commissioner of Education's Task Force on 95 Holocaust Education or from any state or nationally recognized 96 Holocaust educational organizations. The department may contract 97 with any state or nationally recognized Holocaust educational 98 organizations to develop training for instructional personnel 99 and grade-appropriate classroom resources to support the 100 developed curriculum.

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101 <u>2. The second week in November shall be designated as</u> 102 <u>"Holocaust Education Week" in this state in recognition that</u> 103 <u>November is the anniversary of Kristallnacht, widely recognized</u> 104 <u>as a precipitating event that led to the Holocaust.</u>

106 The State Board of Education is encouraged to adopt standards and pursue assessment of the requirements of this subsection. A 107 108 character development program that incorporates the values of the recipients of the Congressional Medal of Honor and that is 109 offered as part of a social studies, English Language Arts, or 110 111 other schoolwide character building and veteran awareness initiative meets the requirements of paragraphs (s) and (t). 112 113 Section 6. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.

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
