7 4.(e) The board of trustees shall aggressively seek avenues to  
 8 generate revenue to support its future endeavors, and shall  
 9 enter into agreements with distance learning providers. The  
 10 board of trustees may acquire, enjoy, use, and dispose of  
 11 patents, copyrights, and trademarks and any licenses and other  
 12 rights or interests thereunder or therein. Ownership of all such  
 13 patents, copyrights, trademarks, licenses, and rights or  
 14 interests thereunder or therein shall vest in the state, with  
 15 the board of trustees having full right of use and full right to  
 16 retain the revenues derived therefrom. Any funds realized from

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17 patents, copyrights, trademarks, or licenses shall be considered  
18 internal funds ~~as provided in s. 1011.07~~. Such funds ~~may shall~~  
19 be used to support the school's marketing and research and  
20 development activities in order to improve courseware and  
21 services to its students.

22 ~~5.(d)~~ The board of trustees shall be responsible for the  
23 administration and control of all internal and local school  
24 funds derived from all activities or sources and shall prescribe  
25 the principles and procedures to be followed in administering  
26 these funds.

27 ~~6.(e)~~ The Florida Virtual School may accrue supplemental  
28 revenue from a direct-support organization in accordance with s.  
29 1001.453. The Florida Virtual School may also accrue  
30 ~~supplemental~~ revenue from supplemental support organizations,  
31 which include, but are not limited to, alumni associations,  
32 ~~foundations,~~ parent-teacher associations, and booster  
33 associations. However, a member of the governing body of such an  
34 organization may not have a business relationship with or  
35 pecuniary interest in the Florida Virtual School. The governing  
36 body of each ~~supplemental support~~ organization shall recommend  
37 the expenditure of moneys collected or generated by it the  
38 ~~organization~~ for the benefit of the school. Such expenditures  
39 shall be contingent upon the review and approval of the

51 compensation, including salaries and fringe benefits, and other  
52 conditions of employment for such personnel.

54 personnel loan or exchange program by which persons employed by  
55 the board of trustees for the Florida Virtual School as academic  
56 administrative and instructional staff may be loaned to, or

69 industry shall be paid by the originating employers of those

71 break in creditable or continuous service or employment during
