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The Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Brandes) recommended the following:

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

Section 1. Study on increasing access to health care in this state.-

(1) The Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability shall conduct a comprehensive study on increasing access to the following health care services in this state: primary care or family medicine; oral health care, including

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general dentistry and dental hygiene services; anesthesia; and psychiatry, psychology, and other licensed mental health services. The study must, at a minimum:

- (a) For each category of health care services and by provider type, examine the status of affordability, access, and delivery of these health care services in this state and identify any delivery system gaps, taking into consideration demographic and income disparities in urban and rural areas;
- (b) Compare the affordability, access, and delivery of such health care services in this state to that of other states;
- (c) Consider the projected growth of this state's population over the next 10 years and the impact that growth will have on the availability of such health care services in urban and rural areas of this state;
- (d) Examine workforce policies authorizing health care providers to practice to the full extent of their education and training or increasing utilization of mid-level health care providers, including, but not limited to, certified registered nurse anesthetists, dental hygienists, dental therapists, licensed practical nurses, mental health counselors, physician assistants, and registered nurses, in order to help fill delivery system gaps; and
- (e) Based on research of policy proposals and practices in other states, make recommendations to the Legislature on ways to increase access to health care in this state by addressing barriers to care, expedience of care delivery, and increased positive health outcomes for unserved or underserved populations.
 - (2) The office shall submit a report on the findings of the



study and its recommendations on increasing access to health care in this state to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by December 31, 2020. The report must address any implementation burdens and the sustainability of each policy recommendation.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
