A bill to be entitled

An act relating to transportation network companies; amending s. 627.748, F.S.; defining the term "authorized user"; authorizing a person who is 18 years of age or older to establish an account with a transportation network company (TNC); providing requirements for establishing an account; authorizing a person to add authorized users to such account under certain circumstances; providing requirements for adding such users; requiring a TNC and a TNC driver to send certain notifications to a person requesting a prearranged ride on behalf of an authorized user; requiring a TNC to allow an authorized user to view such notifications but to prohibit the authorized user from changing the origin or destination of a prearranged ride; requiring a TNC to provide human trafficking awareness training and education to employed TNC drivers; providing training and education requirements; limiting the liability of a TNC in cases of human trafficking; authorizing the Department of Financial Services to seek a court order to require a TNC to comply with certain provisions; providing legislative intent; providing construction; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Present paragraphs (a) through (g) of subsection (1) of section 627.748, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as

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paragraphs (b) through (h), respectively, a new paragraph (a) is added to that subsection, present subsections (12) through (15) are redesignated as subsections (15) through (18), respectively, and new subsections (12), (13), and (14) are added to that section, to read:

- 627.748 Transportation network companies.-
- (1) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Authorized user" means a rider under 18 years of age.
- of age or older may establish an account with a TNC. The TNC must require a person establishing an account to upload to the TNC's digital network a current photograph of himself or herself and a copy or photograph of his or her valid, government-issued identification, including, but not limited to, a driver license, passport, or state or national identification card. The TNC shall activate the person's account once the TNC confirms the person's identity and age.
  - (13) RIDERS UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE.-
- (a) If a TNC provides services to riders under 18 years of age, a person who has established an account with the TNC pursuant to subsection (12) may add one or more authorized users to his or her account. The TNC must require a person adding an authorized user to upload to the TNC's digital network:
  - 1. A current photograph of the authorized user.
  - 2. The authorized user's first name, last name, and age.
  - 3. The authorized user's relationship to the person.
- (b) Upon receipt of a request for a prearranged ride on behalf of an authorized user, the TNC must send a notification via text message to the person making the request which

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## includes:

- 1. A photograph of the TNC driver assigned to transport the authorized user.
- 2. The make, model, and license plate number of the TNC driver's vehicle.
- (c) The TNC driver must send a notification via text message to the person making the request when the authorized user has entered the TNC driver's vehicle and when the authorized user has exited the vehicle at his or her destination.
- (d) A TNC shall allow an authorized user to view the notifications provided pursuant to paragraphs (b) and (c) via an online-enabled technology application but shall not allow an authorized user to change the origin or destination of the prearranged ride.
  - (14) HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS TRAINING AND EDUCATION.-
- (a) By January 1, 2021, each TNC must provide at least 20 minutes of classroom or other effective interactive training and education regarding human trafficking awareness to:
  - 1. Each TNC driver who is employed as of July 1, 2020.
- 2. Each TNC driver who is employed after July 1, 2020, within 6 months after the date of his or her employment.
- (b) 1. After January 1, 2021, each TNC must provide at least 20 minutes of human trafficking awareness training and education as provided in this paragraph to:
- <u>a. Each newly employed TNC driver within 6 months after the</u> date of his or her employment.
- b. Each currently employed TNC driver at least once every 2 years.

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2. The human trafficking awareness training and education required by this paragraph shall include, but is not limited to:

- <u>a. The definitions of human trafficking and commercial</u> <u>exploitation of children.</u>
- b. Identification of individuals who are most at risk for human trafficking.
- c. The difference between labor trafficking and sex trafficking specific to the TNC sector.
- d. The role of TNC drivers in responding to and reporting a possible case of human trafficking.
- e. The contact information of appropriate agencies, including, but not limited to, the toll-free National Human Trafficking Hotline, 1-888-373-7888, and text message line, 233733; the toll-free Florida Abuse Hotline, 1-800-96-ABUSE; and the telephone numbers of the appropriate local law enforcement agencies.
- 3. The human trafficking awareness training and education required by this paragraph may also include, but is not limited to, materials and information provided by the United States

  Department of Justice, the Blue Campaign of the United States

  Department of Homeland Security, the Statewide Council on Human Trafficking, and private nonprofit organizations that represent the interests of victims of human trafficking.
- 4. Failure of a TNC driver to report a case of human trafficking in which the TNC driver's vehicle is involved shall not, by itself, result in the liability of the TNC to the human trafficking victim or victims in the case in question or to any other party.
  - 5. If a TNC violates this subsection, the Department of

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Financial Services may seek a court order requiring the TNC to
comply with this subsection.
6. It is the intent of the Legislature in enacting this
subsection to establish a minimum threshold for human
trafficking awareness training and education provided by a TNC.
This subsection may not be construed to discourage or relieve a
TNC from providing for longer, more frequent, or more extensive
training and education regarding human trafficking awareness.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.

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
