The emergency response policy shall identify the individuals responsible for 48 49 contacting the primary emergency response agency and the 50 emergency response agency that is responsible for notifying the 51 school district for each type of emergency. 52 (d) Establish procedures to provide notification of drills 53 for active shooter and hostage situations to a student's parent 54 before a drill occurs and to provide the parent with the option 55 to excuse his or her student from any physical drills. The 56 procedures must also allow a student whose parent has excused 57 him or her from the physical drills to elect to remain on the 58 school premises during the physical drill and remain excused
