26 schools, must implement a mobile panic button system with 27 interoperability capability to connect diverse emergency 28 services technologies to ensure real-time coordination between multiple first responders. Such system, which shall be referred 29 30 to as "Alyssa's Alert," shall integrate with local public safety 31 answering point infrastructure to transmit 911 calls and mobile 32 device application activations. 33 Section 3. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the sum of \$8 34 million in nonrecurring funds is appropriated from the General 35 Revenue Fund to the Department of Education to implement the mobile panic button system required in s. 1006.07(4)(c), Florida 36 37 Statutes. The department shall issue a competitive solicitation 38 to contract for a statewide mobile panic button system that can 39 be used by all school districts at no cost to the school 40 district. The department shall consult with the school safety 41 specialists designated pursuant to s. 1006.07(6), Florida 42 Statutes, in the development of the competitive solicitation for 43 the statewide mobile panic button system. 44 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
