## Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

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10 11 Between lines 303 and 304

insert:

Section 4. Paragraph (h) of subsection (3) of section 381.96, Florida Statutes, is amended, paragraph (i) is added to that subsection, and subsection (5) is added to that section, to read:

381.96 Pregnancy support and wellness services.-

(3) CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS.—The department contract shall specify the contract deliverables, including financial reports 12

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and other reports due to the department, timeframes for achieving contractual obligations, and any other requirements the department determines are necessary, such as staffing and location requirements. The contract shall require the network to:

- (h) Ensure that informational materials provided to an eligible client by a provider include only are current and accurate information and cite the reference source of any medical statement included in such materials. Such information must be:
- 1. Verified or supported by the weight of medical research conducted in compliance with accepted scientific methods;
- 2. Recognized as correct and objective by leading medical organizations with relevant expertise or by governmental agencies; or
- 3. Recommended by or affirmed in the medical practice guidelines of a nationally recognized accrediting organization.
- (i) Ensure that an obstetrician certified by the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology is available during all times that patients are being treated or counseled.
- (5) CRIMINAL PENALTY.—A person who provides informational materials to a client which are in violation of paragraph (3)(h) commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
