Section 456.064, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 15 16 456.064 Conversion therapy.-(1) As used in this section, the term "conversion therapy" 17 18 means any practice or treatment performed on an individual with 19 the goal of changing the individual's sexual orientation, 20 including, but not limited to, efforts to change behavior, 21 gender identity, or gender expression, or efforts to reduce or 22 eliminate sexual or romantic attraction or feelings toward an 23 individual of the same gender. The term does not include 24 professional counseling that provides:

transition; or

- (b) Support that facilitates an individual's coping, social development, or identity exploration and development, including sexual orientation-neutral interventions to prevent or address unlawful conduct or unsafe sexual practices, provided that the goal of such support is not to change the individual's sexual orientation or gender identity.
- (2) A person who is licensed to provide professional counseling or who provides counseling as part of his or her professional practice under chapter 458, chapter 459, chapter 490, or chapter 491, including, but not limited to, a medical practitioner, osteopathic physician, psychologist, psychotherapist, clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist, or mental health counselor, may not practice or perform conversion therapy on an individual younger than 18 years of age. Any such licensed professional who practices or performs or attempts to practice or perform conversion therapy on an individual younger than 18 years of age engages in unprofessional conduct and is subject to disciplinary proceedings by the department and the appropriate board.

 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
