An act relating to large-capacity magazines; creating s. 790.236, F.S.; defining the term "large-capacity magazine"; prohibiting the sale, transfer, or possession of large-capacity magazines; providing criminal penalties; providing exceptions; providing an

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 790.236, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

790.236 Large-capacity magazines prohibited.-

- (1) DEFINITION.—"Large-capacity magazine" means any ammunition feeding device with the capacity to accept more than 10 rounds, or any conversion kit, part, or combination of parts in the possession or under the control of a person from which such a device can be assembled, but does not include any of the following:
- (a) An ammunition feeding device that has been permanently altered so that it cannot accommodate more than 10 rounds;
 - (b) A .22 caliber tube ammunition feeding device; or
- (c) A tubular magazine that is contained in a lever-action firearm.
- (2) SALE OR TRANSFER.—Except as provided in subsection (4), a person who imports into this state or who distributes, transports, sells, keeps for sale, offers or exposes for sale, or gives a large-capacity magazine within this state commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s.

- (3) POSSESSION.—Except as provided in subsection (4), a person who possesses within this state a large-capacity magazine commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (4) EXCEPTIONS.—This section does not apply to the sale, transfer, or possession of a large-capacity magazine by employees of the Department of Law Enforcement, a law enforcement agency as defined in s. 934.02, the Department of Corrections, or the Armed Forces of the United States or of this state for use in the discharge of their official duties and does not prohibit the use or possession of large-capacity magazines by sworn members of these agencies when on duty if their use is within the scope of their duties.

Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2020.
