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16	Section 1. Subsections (7) and (8) of section 1007.27,
17	Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
18	1007.27 Articulated acceleration mechanisms
19	(7) The International Baccalaureate Program shall be the
20	curriculum in which eligible secondary students are enrolled in
21	a program of studies offered through the International
22	Baccalaureate Program administered by the International
23	Baccalaureate Office. The State Board of Education and the Board
24	of Governors shall specify in the statewide articulation
25	agreement required by s. 1007.23(1) the cutoff scores and
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26 International Baccalaureate Examinations which will be used to 27 grant postsecondary credit at Florida College System 28 institutions and universities. Any changes to the articulation 29 agreement, which have the effect of raising the required cutoff 30 score or of changing the International Baccalaureate 31 Examinations which will be used to grant postsecondary credit, 32 shall only apply to students taking International Baccalaureate 33 Examinations after such changes are adopted by the State Board of Education and the Board of Governors. Students shall be 34 35 awarded a maximum of 30 semester credit hours pursuant to this 36 subsection. The specific course for which a student may receive 37 such credit shall be specified in the statewide articulation agreement required by s. 1007.23(1). Students enrolled pursuant 38 39 to this subsection shall be exempt from the payment of any fees for administration of the examinations regardless of whether or 40 41 not the student achieves a passing score on the examination.

42 (8) The Advanced International Certificate of Education 43 Program and the International General Certificate of Secondary 44 Education (pre-AICE) Program shall be the curricula in which 45 eligible secondary students are enrolled in programs of study 46 offered through the Advanced International Certificate of Education Program or the International General Certificate of 47 48 Secondary Education (pre-AICE) Program administered by the 49 University of Cambridge Local Examinations Syndicate. The State 50 Board of Education and the Board of Governors shall specify in

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51 the statewide articulation agreement required by s. 1007.23(1)52 the cutoff scores and Advanced International Certificate of 53 Education examinations which will be used to grant postsecondary 54 credit at Florida College System institutions and universities. 55 Any changes to the cutoff scores, which changes have the effect 56 of raising the required cutoff score or of changing the Advanced 57 International Certification of Education examinations which will 58 be used to grant postsecondary credit, shall apply to students 59 taking Advanced International Certificate of Education 60 examinations after such changes are adopted by the State Board of Education and the Board of Governors. Students shall be 61 62 awarded a maximum of 30 semester credit hours pursuant to this 63 subsection. The specific course for which a student may receive 64 such credit shall be determined by the Florida College System institution or university that accepts the student for 65 admission. Students enrolled in either program of study pursuant 66 67 to this subsection shall be exempt from the payment of any fees 68 for administration of the examinations regardless of whether the 69 student achieves a passing score on the examination.

Section 2. Paragraph (n) of subsection (1) of section
1011.62, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

72 1011.62 Funds for operation of schools.—If the annual 73 allocation from the Florida Education Finance Program to each 74 district for operation of schools is not determined in the 75 annual appropriations act or the substantive bill implementing

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76 the annual appropriations act, it shall be determined as 77 follows:

(1) COMPUTATION OF THE BASIC AMOUNT TO BE INCLUDED FOR OPERATION.—The following procedure shall be followed in determining the annual allocation to each district for operation:

82 (n) Calculation of additional full-time equivalent 83 membership based on college board advanced placement scores of students and earning college board advanced placement capstone 84 diplomas.-A value of 0.16 full-time equivalent student 85 membership shall be calculated for each student in each advanced 86 87 placement course who receives a score of 3 or higher on the 88 College Board Advanced Placement Examination for the prior year 89 and added to the total full-time equivalent student membership 90 in basic programs for grades 9 through 12 in the subsequent 91 fiscal year. A value of 0.3 full-time equivalent student 92 membership shall be calculated for each student who receives a 93 College Board Advanced Placement Capstone Diploma and meets the 94 requirements for a standard high school diploma under s. 95 1003.4282. Such value shall be added to the total full-time 96 equivalent student membership in basic programs for grades 9 97 through 12 in the subsequent fiscal year. Each district must 98 allocate at least 80 percent of the funds provided to the district for advanced placement instruction, in accordance with 99 100 this paragraph, to the high school that generates the funds. The

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101 school district shall distribute to each classroom teacher who
102 provided advanced placement instruction:

103 1. A bonus in the amount of \$50 for each student taught by 104 the Advanced Placement teacher in each advanced placement course 105 who receives a score of 3 or higher on the College Board 106 Advanced Placement Examination.

107 2. An additional bonus of \$500 to each Advanced Placement 108 teacher in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" who 109 has at least one student scoring 3 or higher on the College 110 Board Advanced Placement Examination, regardless of the number 111 of classes taught or of the number of students scoring a 3 or 112 higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination.

Bonuses awarded under this paragraph shall be in addition to any regular wage or other bonus the teacher received or is scheduled to receive. For such courses, the teacher shall earn an additional bonus of \$50 for each student who has a qualifying score.

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Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.

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
