88 2. Establish a uniform system of procedures to impose 89 disciplinary sanctions for violations of ss. 402.301-402.319. The uniform system of procedures must provide for the consistent 90 application of disciplinary actions across districts and a 91 92 progressively increasing level of penalties from predisciplinary 93 actions, such as efforts to assist licensees or registrants to 94 correct the statutory or regulatory violations, and to severe 95 disciplinary sanctions for actions that jeopardize the health 96 and safety of children, such as for the deliberate misuse of 97 medications.
