Subsection (85) is added to section 320.08058, 11 12 Florida Statutes, to read: 13 320.08058 Specialty license plates.-14 (85) SOLAR POWER LICENSE PLATES. -(a) The department shall develop a Solar Power license 15 16 plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate 17 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The 18 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the 19 words "Solar Power" must appear at the bottom of the plate. 20 The annual use fees shall be distributed to the 21 Florida Solar Energy Research and Education Foundation (FlaSEREF) to be used as follows: 22 1. Up to 10 percent may be used for continuing promotion 23 24 and marketing of the plate and administrative costs directly 25 associated with the plate and the foundation's programs.

2. Fifteen percent shall be distributed to the Florida
Solar Energy Center at the University of Central Florida for the
sole purpose of developing and administering solar energy
industry workforce training programs, including internships,
apprenticeships, advanced technical training, and related
programs, in coordination with FlaSEREF and the Florida Solar
Energy Industries Association (FlaSEIA).

- 3. Fifteen percent shall be distributed to veteran support facilities within this state for the development of solar demonstration projects intended to lower the operating costs of such facilities.
- 4. The remaining proceeds shall be used for administrative expenses of FlaSEREF and FlaSEIA and to increase the public's awareness of solar energy education and research and the benefits of solar energy.

Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2020, but only if HB 697 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law.
