Amendment (with title amendment)

Remove lines 63-101 and insert:

1. Make training and resources available to each member school for the effective monitoring of heat stress.
2. Establish guidelines for monitoring heat stress and identify heat stress levels at which a school must make a cooling zone available for each outdoor athletic contest, practice, workout, or conditioning session. Heat stress must be determined by measuring the ambient temperature, humidity, wind speed, sun angle, and cloud cover at the site of the athletic activity.

15 3. Require member schools to monitor heat stress and
16 modify athletic activities, including suspending or moving
17 activities, based on the heat stress guidelines.

18 4. Establish hydration guidelines, including appropriate
19 introduction of electrolytes after extended activities or when a
20 student participates in multiple activities in a day.

21 5. Establish requirements for cooling zones, including, at
22 a minimum, the immediate availability of cold-water immersion
23 tubs or equivalent means to rapidly cool internal body
24 temperature when a student exhibits symptoms of exertional heat
25 stroke and the presence of an employee or volunteer trained to
26 implement cold-water immersion.

27 6. Require each school's emergency action plan, as
28 required by the FHSAA, to include a procedure for onsite cooling
29 using cold-water immersion or equivalent means before a student
30 is transported to a hospital for exertional heat stroke.

32 The requirements of this paragraph apply year round.

33 (b) Each athletic coach and sponsor of extracurricular
34 activities involving outdoor practices or events shall annually
35 complete training in exertional heat illness identification,
36 prevention, and response, including the effective administration
37 of cooling zones.
