61	(2)(a) In order to better protect student athletes
62	participating in athletics during hot weather and avoid
63	preventable injury or death, the FHSAA shall:
64	1. Make training and resources available to each member
65	school for the effective monitoring of heat stress.
66	2. Establish guidelines for monitoring heat stress and
67	identify heat stress levels at which a school must make a
68	cooling zone available for each outdoor athletic contest,
69	practice, workout, or conditioning session. Heat stress must be
70	determined by measuring the ambient temperature, humidity, wind
71	speed, sun angle, and cloud cover at the site of the athletic
72	activity.
73	3. Require member schools to monitor heat stress and
74	modify athletic activities, including suspending or moving
75	activities, based on the heat stress guidelines.

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76	4. Establish hydration guidelines, including appropriate
77	introduction of electrolytes after extended activities or when a
78	student participates in multiple activities in a day.
79	5. Establish requirements for cooling zones, including, at
80	a minimum, the immediate availability of cold-water immersion
81	tubs or equivalent means to rapidly cool internal body
82	temperature when a student exhibits symptoms of exertional heat
83	stroke and the presence of an employee or volunteer trained to
84	implement cold-water immersion.
85	6. Require each school's emergency action plan, as
86	required by the FHSAA, to include a procedure for onsite cooling
87	using cold-water immersion or equivalent means before a student
88	is transported to a hospital for exertional heat stroke.

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participating in interscholastic athletic competition or who are 101 102 candidates for an interscholastic athletic team to 103 satisfactorily pass a medical evaluation each year prior to 104 participating in interscholastic athletic competition or 105 engaging in any practice, tryout, workout, conditioning, or 106 other physical activity associated with the student's candidacy 107 for an interscholastic athletic team, including activities that 108 occur outside of the school year. Such medical evaluation may be administered only by a practitioner licensed under chapter 458, 109 chapter 459, chapter 460, or s. 464.012, and in good standing 110 with the practitioner's regulatory board. The bylaws shall 111 112 establish requirements for eliciting a student's medical history and performing the medical evaluation required under this 113 114 paragraph, which shall include a physical assessment of the 115 student's physical capabilities to participate in interscholastic athletic competition as contained in a uniform 116 117 preparticipation physical evaluation and history form. The evaluation form shall incorporate the recommendations of the 118 119 American Heart Association for participation cardiovascular screening and shall provide a place for the signature of the 120 121 practitioner performing the evaluation with an attestation that 122 each examination procedure listed on the form was performed by the practitioner or by someone under the direct supervision of 123 124 the practitioner. The form shall also contain a place for the 125 practitioner to indicate if a referral to another practitioner

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126 was made in lieu of completion of a certain examination 127 procedure. The form shall provide a place for the practitioner 128 to whom the student was referred to complete the remaining 129 sections and attest to that portion of the examination. The 130 preparticipation physical evaluation form shall advise students 131 to complete a cardiovascular assessment and shall include 132 information concerning alternative cardiovascular evaluation and diagnostic tests. Results of such medical evaluation must be 133 134 provided to the school. A student is not eligible to participate, as provided in s. 1006.15(3), in any 135 136 interscholastic athletic competition or engage in any practice, tryout, workout, or other physical activity associated with the 137 student's candidacy for an interscholastic athletic team until 138 the results of the medical evaluation have been received and 139 140 approved by the school.

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Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.

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
