6 Section 13. Paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (1) and  
7 subsection (4) of section 1008.34, Florida Statutes, are amended  
8 to read:

9 1008.34 School grading system; school report cards;  
10 district grade.—

11 (1) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of the statewide,  
12 standardized assessment program and school grading system, the  
13 following terms are defined:

14 (a) "Achievement level," "student achievement," or  
15 "achievement" describes the level of content mastery a student  
16 has acquired in a particular subject as measured by a statewide,

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17 standardized assessment administered pursuant to s.  
18 1008.22(3)(a) and (b). There are five achievement levels. Level  
19 1 is the lowest achievement level, level 5 is the highest  
20 achievement level, and level 3 indicates satisfactory  
21 performance. A student passes an assessment if the student  
22 achieves a level 3, level 4, or level 5. For purposes of the  
23 Florida Alternate Assessment administered pursuant to s.  
24 1008.22(3)(d) ~~s. 1008.22(3)(e)~~, the state board shall provide,  
25 in rule, the number of achievement levels and identify the  
26 achievement levels that are considered passing.

27 (b) "Learning Gains," ~~"annual learning gains,"~~ or "student  
28 learning gains" means the degree of student learning growth  
29 occurring over time ~~from one school year to the next~~ as required  
30 by state board rule for purposes of calculating school grades  
31 under this section.

32 (4) SCHOOL REPORT CARD.—The Department of Education shall  
33 annually develop, in collaboration with the school districts, a  
34 school report card to be provided by the school district to  
35 parents within the district. The report card shall include the  
36 school's grade; student performance in English Language Arts,  
37 mathematics, science, and social studies; information regarding  
38 school improvement; an explanation of school performance as  
39 evaluated by the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act  
40 (ESEA), 20 U.S.C. ss. 6301 et seq. which, beginning with the  
41 2022-2023 school year, must include the assessment results under

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42 s. 1008.22(3)(c) as approved by the United States Department of  
43 Education; and indicators of return on investment. Each school's  
44 report card shall be published annually by the department on its  
45 website based upon the most recent data available.
