The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that building plans, blueprints, schematic drawings, 138 139 and diagrams, including draft, preliminary, and final formats, 140 which depict the structural elements of 911, E911, or public 141 safety radio communication system infrastructure, including 142 towers, antennae, equipment or facilities used to provide 911, 143 E911, or public safety radio communication services, and other 144 911, E911, or public safety radio communication structures or 145 facilities owned and operated by an agency, and geographical 146 maps indicating the actual or proposed locations of such 147 communication system infrastructure, structures, or facilities should be made exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and 148 149 s. 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution to ensure the 150 security of emergency communication infrastructure, structures,

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151	and facilities. In addition, the Legislature finds that it is a
152	public necessity that any portion of a meeting revealing such
153	documents and maps that are held by an agency should be made

155	of the State Constitution. Building plans, blueprints, schematic
156	drawings, and diagrams, including draft, preliminary, and final
157	formats, received and held by counties, municipalities, and
158	other governmental agencies that depict the structural elements
159	of 911, E911, or public safety radio communication system
160	infrastructure, structures, and facilities are currently subject
161	to release as public records upon request. Similarly,
162	geographical maps showing the present or proposed locations of
163	such 911, E911, or public safety radio communication system
164	infrastructure, structures, and facilities that are in the
165	possession of counties, municipalities, and other governmental
166	agencies are also subject to release as public records upon
167	request. Counties, municipalities and other governmental
168	agencies may review the building plans or geographical maps to
169	ensure compliance with land development regulations, building
170	codes, agency rules, and standards to protect the public health
171	and safety. These building plans include diagrams and schematic
172	drawings of emergency communication systems, electrical systems,
173	and other physical plant and security details which depict the
174	structural elements of such emergency communications facilities
175	and structures. 911, E911, and public safety radio communication

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176	facilities, including towers and antennae, are a vital link in
177	the chain of survival. Such critical infrastructure must be
178	protected as any disruption during an active shooter or other
179	terror event is very likely to result in greater loss of life
180	and property damage. To function properly, towers and antennae
181	need to be visible, increasing the security risk of such
182	facilities. Because architectural and engineering plans reviewed
183	and held by counties, municipalities and other government
184	agencies include information about tower, equipment, ancillary
185	facilities, critical systems, and restricted areas, these plans
186	could be used by criminals or terrorists to examine the physical
187	plant for vulnerabilities. Information contained in these
188	documents could aid in the planning of, training for, and
189	execution of criminal actions including cyber-crime, arson, and
190	terrorism. Consequently, the Legislature finds that it is a
191	public necessity to exempt such information from public records
192	requirements to reduce exposure to security threats and protect
193	the public.
194	Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
