Subsections (2) through (8) of section 465.189, 8 Florida Statutes, are renumbered as sections (3) through (7), 9 respectively, subsection (1) and present subsection (6) are 10 amended, and a new subsection (2) is added to that section, to 11 read:

12 465.189 Administration of vaccines and epinephrine 13 autoinjection.-

(1) In accordance with guidelines of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for each recommended immunization or vaccine, a pharmacist, or a registered intern under the 089395 - h0825-strike.docx

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17 supervision of a pharmacist who is certified under subsection
18 (7) (6), may administer the following vaccines to an adult
19 within the framework of an established protocol under a
20 supervising physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459:

21 (a) Immunizations or vaccines listed in the Adult 22 Immunization Schedule as of February 1, 2015, by the United 23 States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Recommended 24 Prevention. The board may authorize, by rule, additional immunizations or vaccines as they are added to the Adult 25 26 Immunization Schedule, the United States Centers for Disease 27 Control and Prevention's Health Information for International 28 Travel, or the United States Food and Drug Administration's 29 Vaccines Licensed for Use in the United States.

30 (b) Immunizations or vaccines recommended by the United 31 States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for 32 international travel as of July 1, 2015. The board may 33 authorize, by rule, additional immunizations or vaccines as they 34 are recommended by the United States Centers for Disease Control 35 and Prevention for international travel.

36 <u>(b) (c)</u> Immunizations or vaccines approved by the board in 37 response to a state of emergency declared by the Governor 38 pursuant to s. 252.36.

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40 A registered intern who administers an immunization or vaccine41 under this subsection must be supervised by a certified

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42 pharmacist at a ratio of one pharmacist to one registered 43 intern.

44 (2) <u>A pharmacist who is certified under subsection (7) may</u>
45 <u>administer influenza vaccines to individuals age 7 and older</u>
46 <u>within the framework of an established protocol under a</u>
47 <u>supervising physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459.</u>

48 (3) In order to address any unforeseen allergic reaction, 49 a pharmacist may administer epinephrine using an autoinjector 50 delivery system within the framework of an established protocol 51 under a supervising physician licensed under chapter 458 or 52 chapter 459.

53 (7) (6) Any pharmacist or registered intern seeking to 54 administer vaccines to adults under this section must be certified to administer such vaccines pursuant to a 55 56 certification program approved by the Board of Pharmacy in 57 consultation with the Board of Medicine and the Board of 58 Osteopathic Medicine. The certification program shall, at a 59 minimum, require that the pharmacist attend at least 20 hours of 60 continuing education classes approved by the board and the 61 registered intern complete at least 20 hours of coursework 62 approved by the board. The program shall have a curriculum of instruction concerning the safe and effective administration of 63 such vaccines, including, but not limited to, potential allergic 64 reactions to such vaccines. 65
