Each applicant for examination shall submit a \$20 nonrefundable fee. 20 The department shall by rule specify the general areas 21 (a) of competency to be covered by each examination and the relative 22 weight to be assigned in grading each area tested. 23 The department shall by rule specify the requirements 24 (b) 25 for agents qualified to administer the written competency 26 examinations required by this part. 27 (c)1. The department shall by rule establish a separate 28 written competency examination for a person applying for a 29 license to engage in category I activities solely related to the 30 service and repair of recreational vehicles.
