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26 funds to the clerks of the court to compensate jurors, to pay 27 for meals or lodging provided to jurors, and to pay for jury-28 related personnel costs as provided in this section. Each clerk of the court shall forward to the Justice Administrative 29 30 Commission a quarterly estimate of funds necessary to compensate jurors and pay for meals or lodging provided to jurors during 31 32 the upcoming quarter. The Florida Clerks of Court Operations 33 Corporation shall forward to the Justice Administrative Commission a quarterly estimate of the amount necessary to 34 reimburse each clerk of the court for its personnel and other 35 36 costs related to jury management. Upon receipt of such 37 estimates, the Justice Administrative Commission shall determine the amount deemed necessary for payment to the clerks of the 38 39 court during the upcoming quarter and submit a request for payment to the Chief Financial Officer. 58	(1) The Clerks of the Court Trust Fund is created within

64	deposited in the trust fund include revenues designated for that
