13	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

15	Section 1. Subsection (6) is added to section 1004.015,
16	Florida Statutes, to read:
17	1004.015 Florida Talent Development Council
18	(6) By December 1, 2021, the council shall submit to the
19	Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House
20	of Representatives, the Board of Governors, and the State Board
21	of Education a report with an overview of existing career
22	pathway programs and recommendations that address the
23	feasibility of establishing and implementing the Career Pathways
24	for Florida's Future (CaP-FL) program in this state. As used in
25	this subsection, the term "CaP-FL program" means a program that

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26	incorporates secondary and postsecondary education with
27	workforce education and work experience using a flexible 6-year
28	integrated model. The report must, at a minimum, include all of
29	the following:
30	(a) A school model program for students to earn a high
31	school diploma, an associate degree, and applicable industry
32	certifications and work experience within 6 years after
33	enrolling in the 9th grade. Magnet schools, schools-within-a-
34	school, charter schools, pilot programs, and other school model
35	options may be considered by the council.
36	(b) An overview of existing career pathway programs in
37	this state.
38	(c) A funding model that ensures that the CaP-FL program
39	is provided at no cost to students. Funding model
40	recommendations may incorporate K-12, postsecondary, workforce,
41	grants, scholarships, and other funding options.
42	(d) Recommendations for modifications to the school and
43	district accountability requirements of s. 1008.34 to
44	accommodate flexibility within the model program.
45	(e) An open enrollment policy that encourages a diverse
46	student body that includes students from low-income families and
47	first-generation college students.
48	(f) Courses of study which support program completion in 4
49	to 6 years and which meet regional workforce demand.
50	(g) School governance and staffing recommendations,
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51	including faculty qualifications.
52	(h) Timelines and additional funding requirements for
53	planning and launching a CaP-FL program at a school.
54	(i) A plan for seamless articulation with the
55	postsecondary institutions of this state.
56	(j) Recommendations for partnerships with industries and
57	businesses, which include private investment, work-based
58	training, internships, and priority placement for job
59	opportunities upon graduation.
60	(k) A support model for student success, which may include
61	flexible class scheduling, advising and mentoring components,
62	and other wrap-around services.
63	Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
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
