19	need for tuition and fees and may not exceed the maximum annual
20	award amount specified in the General Appropriations Act. A
21	demonstrated unmet need of less than \$200 shall render the
22	applicant ineligible for a Florida postsecondary student

24	(a) Awards may be made to full-time degree-seeking

(b) 34 Awards may be made to full-time degree-seeking 35 students who have been accepted at a competency-based nonprofit virtual postsecondary institution that is accredited by a member 36 37 of the Council of Regional Accrediting Commissions and is created by the governors of several states, has established and 38 39 continually maintains a location of operation in this state, and 40 maintains a governing body or advisory board in this state. The 41 competency-based nonprofit virtual postsecondary institution 42 must have established its presence and location of operation in 43 this state and its governing body or advisory board in this 44 state at least 1 year before the institution's students are 45 eligible to receive a Florida postsecondary student assistance 46 grant. 47 (c) Awards may be made to full-time certificate-seeking 48 students who have been accepted at an aviation maintenance 49 school that is located in this state, certified by the Federal

50 Aviation Administration, and licensed by the Commission for

53 If funds are available, a student who received an award in the 54 fall or spring term may receive an award in the summer term. 55 Priority in the distribution of summer awards shall be given to 56 students who are within one semester of completing a degree or 57 certificate program. No student may receive an award for more 58 than the equivalent of 9 semesters or 14 quarters of full-time 59 enrollment, except as otherwise provided in s. 1009.40(3). A 60 student specified in paragraph (c) is eligible for an award up to 110 percent of the number of clock hours required to complete 61 62 the program in which the student is enrolled.

(d) (b) A student applying for a Florida postsecondary
student assistance grant shall be required to apply for the Pell
Grant. The Pell Grant entitlement shall be considered when
conducting an assessment of the financial resources available to
each student.

68 (e) (c) Priority in the distribution of grant moneys may be 69 given to students who are within one semester of completing a 70 degree or certificate program. An institution may not make a 71 grant from this program to a student whose expected family 72 contribution exceeds one and one-half times the maximum Pell 73 Grant-eligible family contribution. An institution may not 74 impose additional criteria to determine a student's eligibility 75 to receive a grant award.

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76 <u>(f)-(d)</u> Each participating institution shall report to the 77 department by the established date the students eligible for the 78 program for each academic term. Each institution shall also 79 report to the department necessary demographic and eligibility 80 data for such students.
