6 Between lines 941 and 942, insert:

7 Section 4. Reciprocity for nonresident qualified patients  
8 and caregivers.—Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, a  
9 qualified patient identification card or caregiver  
10 identification card, or its equivalent, issued under the laws of  
11 another state, any United States territory, or the District of  
12 Columbia, to receive marijuana or a marijuana delivery device  
13 for a medical use by a patient with a qualifying medical  
14 condition, or to permit a person to assist with the medical use  
15 of marijuana by a patient with a qualifying medical condition,  
16 shall have the same force and effect as a medical marijuana use

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17 registry identification card issued by the Department of Health  
18 pursuant to s. 381.986, Florida Statutes.
