16	(1) DEFINITIONSAs used in this section, the term:
17	(a) "Petitioner" means a law enforcement officer <u>;</u> or a law

20	stepparent-stepchild relationship and a grandparent-grandchild
21	relationship; an individual who is the legal guardian of a
22	respondent; an individual who is the spouse of a respondent; or

24	protection order under this section.
25	(2) PETITION FOR A RISK PROTECTION ORDER.—There is created

27	(a) A petition for a risk protection order may be filed by
