> Section 10. Section 443.1113, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

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443.1113 Reemployment Assistance Claims and Benefits Information System.-

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(1) The Department of Economic Opportunity shall maintain a system for the efficient distribution of benefits and the

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effective operation and management of the reemployment assistance program. The To the extent that funds are appropriated for each phase of the Reemployment Assistance Claims and Benefits Information system may be cited by the Legislature, the Department of Economic Opportunity shall replace and enhance the functionality provided in the following systems with an integrated Internet-based system that is known as the "Reemployment Assistance Claims and Benefits Information System" and must:

- (a) Be accessible through the Internet Claims and benefit mainframe system.
- (b) Be accessible on mobile devices and personal computers Florida unemployment Internet direct.
- (c) Process reemployment assistance claims Florida continued claim Internet directory.
- (d) Process benefit payments Call center interactive response system.
- (e) Monitor for and manage the collection of overpayments Benefit overpayment screening system.
- (f) Perform adjudication functions Internet and Intranet appeals system.
 - (g) Process appeals and manage appeal hearings.
 - (h) Manage and process employer charging.
- (2) Wherever cost-effective and operationally feasible, the Reemployment Assistance Claims and Benefits System shall accomplish the following main business objectives:
- (a) Wherever cost-effective and operationally feasible, Eliminate or automate existing paper processes and enhance any existing automated workflows in order to expedite customer

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transactions and eliminate redundancy.

- (b) Enable and enhance online, self-service capabilities access to claimant and employer information and federal and state reporting.
- (c) Integrate benefit payment control with the adjudication program and collection system in order to improve the detection of fraud.
- (d) Comply with all requirements established in federal and state law for reemployment assistance.
- (e) Integrate with the Department of Revenue's statewide unified tax system that collects reemployment assistance taxes.
- (3) The scope of the Reemployment Assistance Claims and Benefits Information System does not include any of the following functionalities:
 - (a) Collection of reemployment assistance taxes.
- (b) General ledger, financial management, or budgeting capabilities.
 - (c) Human resource planning or management capabilities.
- (4)(a) The Department of Economic Opportunity shall perform an annual review of the system and identify enhancements or modernization efforts that improve the delivery of services to claimants and employers and reporting to state and federal entities.
- (b) The Department shall seek input on recommended enhancements from, at a minimum, the following entities:
- 1. The Florida Digital Service within the Department of Management Services.
- 2. The General Tax Administration Program Office within the Department of Revenue.

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- 3. The Division of Accounting and Auditing within the Department of Financial Services.
- (5) By October 1, 2023, and each year thereafter, the Department of Economic Opportunity shall submit a Reemployment Assistance Claims and Benefits Information System report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The report must, at a minimum, include:
- (a) A summary of maintenance, enhancement, and modernization efforts over the last fiscal year.
- (b) A 3-year outlook of recommended enhancements or modernization efforts that includes projected costs and timeframes for completion The project to implement the Reemployment Assistance Claims and Benefits Information System is comprised of the following phases and corresponding implementation timeframes:
- (a) No later than the end of fiscal year 2009-2010 completion of the business re-engineering analysis and documentation of both the detailed system requirements and the overall system architecture.
- (b) The Reemployment Assistance Claims and Benefits Internet portal that replaces the Florida Unemployment Internet Direct and the Florida Continued Claims Internet Directory systems, the Call Center Interactive Voice Response System, the Benefit Overpayment Screening System, the Internet and Intranet Appeals System, and the Claims and Benefits Mainframe System shall be deployed to full operational status no later than the end of fiscal year 2013-2014.
 - (5) The Department of Economic Opportunity shall implement



98 the following project governance structure until such time as 99 the project is completed, suspended, or terminated: (a) The project sponsor for the Reemployment Assistance 100 101 Claims and Benefits Information System project is the 102 department. (b) The project shall be governed by an executive steering 103 104 committee composed of the following voting members or their 105 designees: 106 1. The executive director of the department. 107 2. The executive director of the Department of Revenue. 3. The director of the Division of Workforce Services 108 109 within the department. 110 4. The program director of the General Tax Administration 111 Program Office within the Department of Revenue. 112 5. The chief information officer of the department. 113 (c) The executive steering committee has the overall responsibility for ensuring that the project meets its primary objectives and is specifically responsible for: 115 116 1. Providing management direction and support to the 117 project management team. 2. Assessing the project's alignment with the strategic 118 119 goals of the department for administering the reemployment 120 assistance program. 121 3. Reviewing and approving or disapproving any changes to 122 the project's scope, schedule, and costs. 123 4. Reviewing, approving or disapproving, and determining 124 whether to proceed with any major project deliverables. 5. Recommending suspension or termination of the project to 125

the Covernor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of

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127 the House of Representatives if it determines that the primary objectives cannot be achieved. 128 (d) The project management team shall work under the 129 130 direction of the executive steering committee and shall be 131 minimally comprised of senior managers and stakeholders from the department and the Department of Revenue. The project management 132 133 team is responsible for: 1. Providing daily planning, management, and oversight of 134 135 the project. 136 2. Submitting an operational work plan and providing 137 quarterly updates to that plan to the executive steering 138 committee. The plan must specify project milestones, 139 deliverables, and expenditures. 140 3. Submitting written monthly project status reports to the 141 executive steering committee which include: 142 a. Planned versus actual project costs; b. An assessment of the status of major milestones and 143 deliverables; 144 145 c. Identification of any issues requiring resolution, the 146 proposed resolution for these issues, and information regarding the status of the resolution; 147 d. Identification of risks that must be managed; and 148 149 e. Identification of and recommendations regarding 150 necessary changes in the project's scope, schedule, or costs. 151 All recommendations must be reviewed by project stakeholders 152 before submission to the executive steering committee in order 153 to ensure that the recommendations meet required acceptance 154 criteria.

Section 11. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, the Department

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of Economic Opportunity shall take actions to modernize the Reemployment Assistance Claims and Benefits Information System as provided in the General Appropriations Act.
