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12	Section 1. Paragraph (c) of subsection (3) of section
13	1008.22, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
14	1008.22 Student assessment program for public schools
15	(3) STATEWIDE, STANDARDIZED ASSESSMENT PROGRAMThe
16	Commissioner of Education shall design and implement a
17	statewide, standardized assessment program aligned to the core
18	curricular content established in the Next Generation Sunshine
19	State Standards. The commissioner also must develop or select
20	and implement a common battery of assessment tools that will be
21	used in all juvenile justice education programs in the state.
22	These tools must accurately measure the core curricular content
23	established in the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards.
24	Participation in the assessment program is mandatory for all
25	school districts and all students attending public schools,
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26 including adult students seeking a standard high school diploma 27 under s. 1003.4282 and students in Department of Juvenile 28 Justice education programs, except as otherwise provided by law. 29 If a student does not participate in the assessment program, the 30 school district must notify the student's parent and provide the parent with information regarding the implications of such 31 32 nonparticipation. The statewide, standardized assessment program 33 shall be designed and implemented as follows:

34 (c) Students with disabilities <u>and students who have</u>
35 <u>limited English proficiency</u>; Florida Alternate Assessment.-

36 1. Each district school board must provide instruction to 37 prepare students with disabilities <u>and students who have limited</u> 38 <u>English proficiency</u> in the core content knowledge and skills 39 necessary for successful grade-to-grade progression and high 40 school graduation.

41 2. A student with a disability, as defined in s. 1007.02, 42 or a student who has limited English proficiency as defined in 43 s. 1003.56(2)(a), for whom the individual education plan (IEP) 44 team or English Language Learner Committee, respectively, determines that the statewide, standardized assessments under 45 46 this section cannot accurately measure the student's abilities, taking into consideration all allowable accommodations, shall 47 48 have assessment results waived for the purpose of receiving a course grade and a standard high school diploma. Such waiver 49 50 shall be designated on the student's transcript. The statement

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51 of waiver shall be limited to a statement that performance on an 52 assessment was waived for the purpose of receiving a course 53 grade or a standard high school diploma, as applicable.

54 3. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules, based 55 upon recommendations of the commissioner, for the provision of 56 assessment accommodations for students with disabilities and for 57 students who have limited English proficiency.

58 Accommodations that negate the validity of a statewide, a. 59 standardized assessment are not allowed during the 60 administration of the assessment. However, instructional accommodations are allowed in the classroom if identified in a 61 62 student's IEP. Students using instructional accommodations in 63 the classroom that are not allowed on a statewide, standardized 64 assessment may have assessment results waived if the IEP team 65 determines that the assessment cannot accurately measure the student's abilities. 66

67 If a student is provided with instructional b. 68 accommodations in the classroom that are not allowed as 69 accommodations for statewide, standardized assessments, the 70 district must inform the parent in writing and provide the 71 parent with information regarding the impact on the student's 72 ability to meet expected performance levels. A parent must provide signed consent for a student to receive classroom 73 74 instructional accommodations that would not be available or 75 permitted on a statewide, standardized assessment and

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76 acknowledge in writing that he or she understands the 77 implications of such instructional accommodations. 78 с. If a student's IEP states that online administration of a statewide, standardized assessment will significantly impair 79 80 the student's ability to perform, the assessment shall be 81 administered in hard copy. 4. For students with significant cognitive disabilities, 82 the Department of Education shall provide for implementation of 83 the Florida Alternate Assessment to accurately measure the core 84 85 curricular content established in the Next Generation Sunshine 86 State Standards. 87 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021.

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
