An act relating to home-based businesses; creating s.

559.955, F.S.; providing legislative findings and intent; specifying conditions under which a business is considered a home-based business; authorizing a home-based business to operate in a residential zone under certain circumstances; preempting to the state

the ability to regulate or license home-based businesses; prohibiting a local government from certain actions relating to the licensure and

regulation of home-based businesses; providing an

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 559.955, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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559.955 Home-based businesses; legislative findings and intent; preemption.—

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(1) It is the intent of the Legislature to encourage small and home-based business enterprises. To that end, the Legislature finds that:

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(a) Small and home-based businesses are a critical part of the economy of this state and provide unique and valuable benefits to the communities in which they are located.

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(b) Residential property is often the most valuable asset owned by a potential small business entrepreneur.

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(c) Residential property can be put to beneficial use by potential small business entrepreneurs in ways that are

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consistent with residential use.

(2) For purposes of this section, a business is considered a home-based business if it operates, in whole or in part, from a residential property and meets the following criteria:

- (a) The employees of the home-based business reside in the residential dwelling or are immediate family members of residents of the dwelling, except that up to two employees are not required to be related to a resident of or reside in the dwelling.
- (b) Parking related to the business activities of the homebased business complies with local zoning requirements.
- (c) The business activities of the home-based business do not generate a substantial increase in any of the following:
 - 1. Traffic.
 - 2. Noise.
 - 3. Waste or recycling.
- (d) As viewed from the street, the use of the residential property is consistent with the uses of the residential areas that surround the property.
- (e) The activities of the home-based business are secondary to the property's use as a residential dwelling.
- (3) (a) A home-based business that operates from a residential property as provided in subsection (2) may operate in an area zoned for residential use.
- (b) A residential dwelling that is used as a home-based business must meet the applicable standards of the Florida Building Code.
- (4) The licensure and regulation of home-based businesses is preempted to the state, and local governments may not enact
