58	results derived from the administration of examinations and
59	assessments.
60	(4) The state's ability to objectively assess educational
61	progress and performance is impaired if examination and
62	assessment instruments can be publicly disseminated before or
63	after being administered. Public dissemination of already-
64	administered examination and assessment instruments may also
65	invade a student's privacy and harm his or her ability to
66	protect his or her personal information and educational records.
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67 (5) Based on the foregoing, the Legislature finds that the harm that may result from the release of such examination and 68 69 assessment instruments outweighs any public benefit that may be 70 derived from the disclosure of the information. 71 Section 3.
