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9	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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11	Section 1. Chapter 2002-334, Laws of Florida, as amended
12	by chapter 2014-229, Laws of Florida, is amended to read:
13	Section 1. (1) Any entity operating an entertainment or
14	lodging complex within the commercial district of a retirement
15	community <u>within Lake County</u> in the Town of Lady Lake may be
16	issued a special alcoholic beverage license by the Division of
17	Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco of the Department of Business
18	and Professional Regulation permitting the sale of alcoholic
19	beverages, and the manufacture and sale of malt beverages, for
20	consumption on premises only. The complex, including the use of
21	areas or facilities pursuant to the authorization of a community
22	development district, must be managed, controlled, and operated
23	by a primary business entity under one business name and may
24	include only individual business entities that are owned,
25	managed, controlled, and operated independently of the primary
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business entity and that are separately licensed by the Division 26 of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco pursuant to this act. The 27 28 complex must be located within the following boundaries of Lake 29 County the Town of Lady Lake: 30 31 That portion of Sections 6 and 7, Township 18 South, 32 Range 24 East, Town of Lady Lake, Florida, more 33 particularly described as Lots C, D, E, F, G, H, K, Y, and Z, and Tracts 1 and 2, within THE VILLAGE CENTER 34 35 SUBDIVISION, according to the Plat thereof recorded in Plat Book 33, Page 93, Public Records of Lake County, 36 37 Florida. 38 39 Portions of Township 20 South, Range 24 East including portions of Sections 6-9, 16-17, 31 and portions of 40 41 Township 21 South, Range 24 East including portions of 42 Sections 5-7. 43 44 These boundaries encompass a contiguous area separated only by 45 deeded or dedicated rights-of-way. 46 47 For purposes of this section, the term "entity (2)operating an entertainment or lodging complex within the 48 commercial district of a retirement community" means any entity 49 50 operating an entertainment or lodging complex that may include

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51 one or more restaurants, bars, breweries or brew pubs, 52 clubhouses, recreation centers, lodging facilities, banquet 53 facilities, special activity tents, or similar structures or 54 meeting areas, or any combination thereof, consisting of any 55 real estate development located within the property described in 56 subsection (1) and located within any area in which a restaurant 57 or lounge is a permitted use as defined by applicable county or 58 municipal the Town of Lady Lake ordinances or regulations and 59 meeting the following criteria:

(a) A minimum of 15,000 visitors must annually visit thecommercial district of the retirement community.

(b) The complex must provide meeting facilities for atleast 250 persons.

(c) The complex must contain at least two restaurants or
lounges having at least 4,000 square feet of service area
equipped to serve full-course meals to 250 persons at one time.

For purposes of this section, the owner, operator, or controlling entity need not be the same to qualify under criteria listed in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c).

(3) The license authorized by this section shall not entitle the licensee to maintain or construct any structure on the premises that is prohibited by <u>applicable county or</u> <u>municipal</u> the ordinances or regulations of the Town of Lady <u>Lake</u>. This license shall not exempt the licensee from complying

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76 with <u>applicable county or</u> the municipal ordinances <u>or</u> 77 <u>regulations</u> of the Town of Lady Lake. All provisions of the 78 alcoholic beverage laws of the State of Florida not inconsistent 79 herewith shall apply to such license and licensee.

80 Section 2. (1) Any entity operating an entertainment or 81 lodging complex within the commercial district of a retirement 82 community within Sumter County may be issued a special alcoholic 83 beverage license by the Division of Alcoholic Beverages and 84 Tobacco of the Department of Business and Professional 85 Regulation permitting the sale of alcoholic beverages, and the 86 manufacture and sale of malt beverages, for consumption on 87 premises only. The complex, including the use of areas or 88 facilities pursuant to the authorization of a community 89 development district, must be managed, controlled, and operated 90 by a primary business entity under one business name and may include only individual business entities that are owned, 91 92 managed, controlled, and operated independently of the primary 93 business entity and that are separately licensed by the Division 94 of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco pursuant to this act. The 95 complex must be located within the following boundaries of 96 Sumter County:

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Portions of Township 18 South, Range 23 East including portions of Sections 13-17, 21-28, and 33-36.

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101 Portions of Township 19 South, Range 22 East including 102 portions of Section 36 and portions of Township 20 103 South, Range 22 East including portions of Sections 1 104 & 12 and portions of Township 19 South, Range 23 East 105 including portions of Sections 1-4, 8-14, 16-21, 23-106 29, 31-36 and portions of Township 20 South, Range 23 107 East including portions of Sections 1-3, 6, 10-17, 20-108 28, and 31-36 and portions of Township 21 South, Range 109 23 East including portions of Sections 1-11. 110 111 Portions of Township 19 South, Range 23 East including 112 portions of Sections 1-4, 8-14, 16-17, 23-24, and 113 portions of Township 18 South, Range 23 East including portions of Sections 13-17, 21-28, and 33-36. 114 115 These boundaries encompass a contiguous area separated only by 116 117 deeded or dedicated rights-of-way. 118 119 (2) For purposes of this section, the term "entity operating an entertainment or lodging complex within the 120 121 commercial district of a retirement community" means any entity 122 operating an entertainment or lodging complex that may include one or more restaurants, bars, breweries or brew pubs, 123 clubhouses, recreation centers, lodging facilities, banquet 124 125 facilities, special activity tents, or similar structures or

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meeting areas, or any combination thereof, consisting of any real estate development located within the property described in subsection (1) and located within any area in which a restaurant or lounge is a permitted use as defined by <u>applicable county or</u> <u>municipal</u> <u>Sumter County</u> ordinances <u>or regulations</u> and meeting the following criteria:

(a) A minimum of 15,000 visitors must annually visit thecommercial district of the retirement community.

(b) The complex must provide meeting facilities for atleast 250 persons.

(c) The complex must contain at least two restaurants or lounges having at least 4,000 square feet of service area equipped to serve full-course meals to 250 persons at one time.

For purposes of this section, the owner, operator, or controlling entity need not be the same to qualify under criteria listed in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c).
