6 Remove lines 39-44 and insert:

7 5. Receiving a school grade of A or B for at least three
8 consecutive years prior to application for the award.

9 6. For controlled open enrollment seats, at least 5
10 percent shall be reserved for military-connected students.

11 (b) A participating school shall meet at least two of the
12 following requirements in addition to the requirements of
13 paragraph (a):

14 1. Hold one of the following annual school-wide military
15 events: Month of the Military Child, Month of the Military

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16 Family, Purple-Up! For Military Kids!, Veteran's Day, Memorial
17 Day.

18 2. Obtain a school board resolution publicizing support
19 for military students and families.

20 3. Partner with School Liaison Officer (military personnel
21 who work with local schools in support of military-connected
22 children) to provide opportunities for active duty parents to
23 volunteer within the school.

24 4. Maintain a public display recognizing service members,
25 veterans, and/or students and families.

26 5. Engage all students and staff in a project connecting
27 the school with the military community, such as adopt-a-school,
28 letters/care package collection for troops.

29 6. Provide outreach for military parents and their
30 children to connect with and feel supported by the surrounding
31 community, such as relief fund for struggling students, college
32 scholarship opportunities financed by local businesses,
33 cooperative community/school projects, structures to provide
34 parents with community resource information and contacts, family
35 activities - such as STEM or literacy activities - on non-secure
36 areas of military bases.

37 7. Post a welcome video or photo slideshow to highlight
38 certain aspects of the school facility (such as the gym,
39 cafeteria, media center, a typical classroom, playground) on its

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40 website, as a way to help new students transitioning to the
41 area.

42 8. For middle schools and high schools, offer a Junior
43 Reserve Officers' Training Corps (JROTC) program and allow
44 military students to participate upon arrival to the school.

45 (3) A school may partner with a school district to procure
46 digital, professional development, or other assistance necessary
47 for the school to meet the criteria specified in subsection (2).

48 (4) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to
