7 Section 3. Section 1006.185, Florida Statutes, is created
8 to read:

9 1006.185 Opening remarks at high school athletic
 10 contests.—Each athletic association whose membership includes
 11 public schools shall adopt bylaws, policies, or procedures that
 12 provide each school participating in a high school championship
 13 contest, or series of contests, under the direction and
 14 supervision of the association, the opportunity to make brief
 15 opening remarks, if requested by the school, using the public
 16 address system at the event. Such remarks may not be longer than

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17 2 minutes per school. The athletic association may not control,
18 monitor, or review the content of the opening remarks and may
19 not control the school's choice of speaker. Before the opening
20 remarks, an announcement must be made that the content of any
21 opening remarks by a participating school are not endorsed by
22 and do not reflect the views and opinions of the athletic
23 association. The decision to allow opening remarks before
24 regular season contests is at the discretion of each school.
