Beginning in school year 2004-2005, the character development program shall be required in kindergarten through grade 12. Each district school board shall develop or adopt a curriculum for the character development program that shall be submitted to the department for approval.

24 <u>1.</u> The character development curriculum shall stress the 25 qualities of patriotism; responsibility; citizenship; kindness; 26 respect for authority, life, liberty, and personal property; 27 honesty; charity; self-control; racial, ethnic, and religious 28 tolerance; and cooperation.

29 2. The character development curriculum for grades 9 30 through 12 shall, at a minimum, include instruction on developing leadership skills, interpersonal skills, organization 31 32 skills, and research skills; creating a resume; developing and 33 practicing the skills necessary for employment interviews; 34 conflict resolution, workplace ethics, and workplace law; 35 managing stress and expectations; and developing skills that 36 enable students to become more resilient and self-motivated.

37 <u>3. The character development curriculum for grades 11 and</u> 38 <u>12 shall include instruction on voting using the uniform primary</u> 39 <u>and general election ballot described in s. 101.151(9).</u>

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The State Board of Education is encouraged to adopt standards and pursue assessment of the requirements of this subsection. A character development program that incorporates the values of the recipients of the Congressional Medal of Honor and that is offered as part of a social studies, English Language Arts, or other schoolwide character building and veteran awareness initiative meets the requirements of paragraphs (s) and (t).
