6 Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert:

7 Section 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (3) of section  
8 1002.20, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

9 1002.20 K-12 student and parent rights.—Parents of public  
10 school students must receive accurate and timely information  
11 regarding their child's academic progress and must be informed  
12 of ways they can help their child to succeed in school. K-12  
13 students and their parents are afforded numerous statutory  
14 rights including, but not limited to, the following:

15 (3) HEALTH ISSUES.—

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16 (d) *Reproductive health and disease education.*—A public  
17 school student whose parent makes written request to the school  
18 principal shall be exempted from the teaching of reproductive  
19 health or any disease, including HIV/AIDS, in accordance with  
20 ~~the provisions of s. 1003.42(3).~~ Each school district shall  
21 notify parents of this right through publication on the  
22 district's website homepage of the curriculum and materials  
23 described by 1006.28, including the process for a parent to  
24 exercise this right.

25 Section 2. Subsections (1) and (3) of section 1003.42,  
26 Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

27 1003.42 Required instruction.—

28 (1) (a) Each district school board shall provide all  
29 courses required for middle grades promotion, high school  
30 graduation, and appropriate instruction designed to ensure that  
31 students meet State Board of Education adopted standards in the  
32 following subject areas: reading and other language arts,  
33 mathematics, science, social studies, foreign languages, health  
34 and physical education, and the arts. The state board must  
35 remove a middle grades course in the Course Code Directory that  
36 does not fully integrate all appropriate curricular content  
37 required by s. 1003.41 and may approve a new course only if it  
38 meets the required curricular content.

39 (b) All curriculum and materials described by 1006.28 used  
40 for the teaching of reproductive health or any disease,

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41 including HIV/AIDS, its symptoms, development, and treatment, as  
42 part of the courses required by paragraph (a) must be annually  
43 approved by a district school board in an open, noticed public  
44 meeting. School districts must notify parents of public school  
45 students of this meeting.

46 (3) Any student whose parent makes written request to the  
47 school principal shall be exempted from the teaching of  
48 reproductive health or any disease, including HIV/AIDS, its  
49 symptoms, development, and treatment. A student so exempted may  
50 not be penalized by reason of that exemption. Course  
51 descriptions for comprehensive health education shall not  
52 interfere with the local determination of appropriate curriculum  
53 which reflects local values and concerns. Each school district  
54 shall notify parents of this right through publication on the  
55 district's website homepage of the curriculum and materials  
56 described by 1006.28, including the process for a parent to  
57 exercise this right.

58 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021.

72 education in an open, noticed public meeting;  
73 requiring each school district to publish specified  
74 materials on the district website to notify parents of  
75 their right to exempt their student from reproductive  
76 health and disease education; providing an effective  
77 date.

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
