6 Remove lines 273-320 and insert:

7 staff and domestic violence advocates, as defined in s.
8 90.5036(1)(b), of domestic violence centers certified by the
9 Department of Children and Families under chapter 39; the names,
10 home addresses, telephone numbers, places of employment, dates
11 of birth, and photographs of the spouses and children of such
12 personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care
13 facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt
14 from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State
15 Constitution.

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16 3. An agency that is the custodian of the information
17 specified in subparagraph 2. and that is not the employer of the
18 officer, employee, justice, judge, or other person specified in
19 subparagraph 2. shall maintain the exempt status of that
20 information only if the officer, employee, justice, judge, other
21 person, or employing agency of the designated employee submits a
22 written request for maintenance of the exemption to the
23 custodial agency.

24 4. An officer, an employee, a justice, a judge, or other
25 person specified in subparagraph 2. may submit a written request
26 for the release of his or her exempt information to the
27 custodial agency. The written request must be notarized and must
28 specify the information to be released and the party that is
29 authorized to receive the information. Upon receipt of the
30 written request, the custodial agency shall release the
31 specified information to the party authorized to receive such
32 information.

33 5. The exemptions in this paragraph apply to information
34 held by an agency before, on, or after the effective date of the
35 exemption.

36 6. This paragraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset
37 Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed
38 on October 2, 2024, unless reviewed and saved from repeal
39 through reenactment by the Legislature.

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40 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public
41 necessity that the home addresses, telephone numbers, places of
42 employment, dates of birth, and photographs of current or former
43 staff and domestic violence advocates of domestic violence
44 centers certified by the Department of Children and Families
45 under chapter 39; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers,
46 places of employment, dates of birth, and photographs of the
47 spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and
48 locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the
49 children of such personnel be exempt from public records
50 requirements. Such personnel and their family members are at a
51 heightened risk of physical and emotional harm from perpetrators
52 of domestic violence who have contentious reactions to actions
53 taken by such personnel to house and protect victims of domestic
54 violence and limit further harm to such victims. The Legislature
55 further finds that it is necessary to provide safeguards to
56 staff and domestic violence advocates who are
