WHEREAS, according to the American Cancer Society, 235,760 Americans will be newly diagnosed with lung cancer in 2021 and an estimated 18,470 Florida residents alone will be diagnosed with lung cancer in 2021, and

WHEREAS, any person is at risk for developing lung cancer, as there are many other risk factors aside from smoking, including family history, environmental causes, and other lifestyle factors; for example each year, tens of thousands of nonsmokers are diagnosed with lung cancer, and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has led many patients to postpone regular health appointments, meaning that screening and early detection rates of lung cancer will be lower than prior years, and

WHEREAS, research shows that early detection via low-dose CT screening can decrease lung cancer mortality by 14 to 20 percent among high-risk populations, however only 3.2 percent of Florida's high-risk population receives screenings for lung cancer, on average, and
