House Resolution

A resolution recognizing April 2021 as "Minority Health Month" in Florida.

WHEREAS, National Minority Health Month is a month-long national initiative to advance health equity across the country on behalf of all racial and ethnic minorities, and

WHEREAS, National Minority Health Month began with Booker T. Washington advocating for a National Negro Health Week in 1915, and

WHEREAS, in 2002, the United States Congress said that a National Minority Health and Health Disparities Month, "should be established to promote educational efforts on the health problems facing minorities and other health disparity populations," and

WHEREAS, as an example of such health problems and disparities, according to a report by the National Center for Health Statistics, Black women are dying two-and-a-half times more often than white women due to maternal causes, and

WHEREAS, according to a study published in 2019 by a researcher at George Washington University School of Medicine and Health Sciences, Black and Hispanic emergency room patients were 40 percent and 25 percent less likely to receive pain medication than white patients, respectively, and

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WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, certain vulnerable populations, such as non-Hispanic African Americans, individuals living in nonmetropolitan areas, and adults with lower levels of education and income or who do not have health insurance are more likely to forego the COVID-19 vaccine, and

WHEREAS, the theme of this year's National Minority Health Month is "Vaccine Ready," which aims to share the facts about COVID-19 vaccines and help communities practice COVID-19 safety measures and get vaccinated, NOW, THEREFORE,

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Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

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That April 2021 is recognized as "Minority Health Month" in Florida.

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
