## House Resolution

A resolution honoring the 200th anniversary of the proclamation of the Adams-Onís Treaty ceding Florida to the United States and designating February 22, 2021, as "Florida Treaty Day."

WHEREAS, on February 22, 1819, during the reign of King Ferdinand VII, the Secretary of State of the United States, John Quincy Adams, under President James Monroe, and the Minister for Spain, Luis de Onís y González-Vara, signed a treaty that ceded Florida to the United States, which was immediately ratified by the United States Senate but delayed by the government of Spain, and

WHEREAS, the Adams-Onís Treaty of 1819, also known as the Transcontinental Treaty or the Florida Treaty, settled border disputes between the United States and the Spanish Empire throughout North America, and

WHEREAS, the Adams-Onís Treaty was ratified by Spain on October 24, 1820, and a second time by the United States Senate on February 19, 1821, before being finally proclaimed on February 22, 1821, and

WHEREAS, on July 17, 1821, in Pensacola, United States
Commissioner and Governor of East and West Florida, Andrew
Jackson, received Florida from Spanish authorities on behalf of
the American government fulfilling the treaty, NOW, THEREFORE,
