House Resolution

A resolution recognizing March 26, 2021, as "Refugee Day at the Florida Capitol" and June 20, 2021, as "World Refugee Day" in Florida.

WHEREAS, there has been a long bipartisan tradition, keeping with our nation's values and respect for human rights, in welcoming refugees to the United States, and

WHEREAS, the economic and social strength of the United States and the State of Florida derives in large part from the diversity of its citizenry and the strength of those individuals who have left their countries to come to a new home, and

WHEREAS, refugees do not leave their home countries by choice but rather have been forced to flee due to dangerous circumstances and often out of fear of persecution for reasons of race, religion, nationality, political opinion, or membership in a particular social group, and

WHEREAS, Florida has helped resettle countless refugees starting as early as 1960 with Operation Peter Pan, which brought more than 14,000 unaccompanied Cuban minors to the state, and

WHEREAS, Florida has helped resettle refugees from Southeast Asia, including Laos, Cambodia, and Vietnam, and

WHEREAS, refugee status is granted to individuals who demonstrate the greatest and most immediate need for protection

and, since the passage of the Refugee Act of 1980, the United States has admitted more than 3.1 million refugees, with Florida being fourth in the nation for resettling refugees between 2002 and 2017, and

WHEREAS, refugees contribute to our economy in various ways, such as buying or selling homes, being small business owners, paying taxes, innovating and sharing their creativity, and becoming a part of the state's workforce, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That March 26, 2021, marks the third annual "Refugee Day at the Florida Capitol" and June 20, 2021, is recognized as "World Refugee Day" in Florida.
