1 House Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging the United States Senate to convict the 45th President of the United States, Donald John Trump, and to disqualify him from holding and enjoying any office of honor, trust, or profit under the United States.

WHEREAS, the Office of the President of the United States is charged with supporting and defending the Constitution of the United States against enemies, foreign and domestic, and

WHEREAS, the power of the federal executive branch is vested in the President of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the President serves as the head of state and the Commander in Chief of our armed forces, and

WHEREAS, the President holds the duty to faithfully execute the Office of the President of the United States and, to the best of his or her ability, to preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the United States Constitution provides that the House of Representatives "shall have the sole Power of Impeachment" and that the President "shall be removed from Office on Impeachment for, and Conviction of, Treason, Bribery, or other high Crimes and Misdemeanors," and

WHEREAS, President Donald John Trump incited a violent insurrection in our nation's capital when he addressed a crowd

in Washington, D.C. shortly before the Joint Session of Congress commenced to count the votes of the Electoral College, and

WHEREAS, President Trump incited a riot and encouraged domestic terrorism with statements such as "when you catch somebody in a fraud, you are allowed to go by very different rules" and "if you don't fight like hell, you're not going to have a country anymore," and

WHEREAS, the siege of the United States Capitol Building and the subsequent threat to members of Congress, security forces, and the public resulted in the death of five Americans, including that of Capitol Police Officer Brian Sicknick, and

WHEREAS, President Trump's actions on January 6, 2021, followed prior efforts to subvert and obstruct the certification of the results of the 2020 Presidential election, and

WHEREAS, on January 2, 2021, the President urged the Georgia Secretary of State, Brad Raffensperger, to "find" enough votes to overturn Georgia's presidential election results and threatened Secretary Raffensperger if he failed to do so, and

WHEREAS, President Trump gravely endangered the security of the United States and its institutions of Government while threatening the sanctity of the democratic system, and

WHEREAS, President Trump interfered with the peaceful transition of power and jeopardized a coequal branch of Government, and thereby betrayed his trust as President to the manifest injury of the people of the United States, and

WHEREAS, President Trump removed plausible deniability by making statements to violent insurrectionists, such as "we love you, you're very special," after the siege of the Capitol, and

WHEREAS, President Trump was impeached by the United States House of Representatives on January 13, 2021, with a vote of 232-197, making it the most bipartisan House impeachment in the history of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature hereby condemns the violent siege of the United States Capitol Building instigated by President Donald John Trump, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature acknowledges that the United States House of Representatives has voted in favor of impeachment, and

WHEREAS, the United States Senate has the constitutional power and responsibility under s. 3, Art. I of the United States Constitution to hold an impeachment trial, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature acknowledges that the impeachment trial in the United States Senate may conclude before the adoption of this memorial, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature has a unique responsibility to the state President Donald John Trump calls home to condemn his actions and urge for his conviction in the United States Senate or be judged forever by history, NOW, THEREFORE,
