14	Section 1. Section 471.051, Florida Statutes, is created
15	to read:

18	(1) A professional engineer as defined in s. 471.005, a
19	registered architect as defined in s. 481.203, or a certified
20	structures specialist as defined in subsection (2) who
21	voluntarily provides engineering services during a declared
22	state of emergency or within 90 calendar days after the end date
23	of the declared state of emergency is immune from liability for
24	any personal injury, wrongful death, property damage, or other
25	loss related to the professional engineer's, registered

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26 architect's, or certified structures specialist's acts or 27 omissions in the performance of his or her services, provided 28 that the professional engineer, registered architect, or 29 certified structures specialist acted reasonably and in good 30 faith and the act did not involve gross negligence or willful 31 misconduct. 32 (2) As used in this section, the term "structures 33 specialist" means a person who has been trained by and holds a 34 current certificate from the United States Army Corps of 35 Engineers as a Structures Specialist (StS). 36 (3) A person who is licensed, registered, or certified in 37 another state as an engineer, architect, or structures 38 specialist and who voluntarily provides engineering services 39 while participating as a member of another state's mobile 40 support unit which is rendering aid in this state during a 41 declared state of emergency or within 90 calendar days after the 42 end date of the declared state of emergency is immune from 43 liability for any personal injury, wrongful death, property 44 damage, or other loss related to the person's acts or omissions 45 in the performance of his or her services, provided that the 46 person acted reasonably and in good faith and the act did not 47 involve gross negligence or willful misconduct. 48 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021.

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
