Section 22. Section 101.65, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

101.65 Instructions to absent electors.—The supervisor shall enclose with each vote-by-mail ballot separate printed instructions in substantially the following form; however, where the instructions appear in capitalized text, the text of the printed instructions must be in bold font:

## READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY BEFORE MARKING BALLOT.

1. VERY IMPORTANT. In order to ensure that your vote-by-16 17 mail ballot will be counted, it should be completed and returned 18 as soon as possible so that it can be postmarked or dated no 19 later than the day of the election, if mailed, and reach the supervisor of elections of the county in which your precinct is 20 21 located no later than 10 days after 7 p.m. on the date day of 22 the election. However, if you are an overseas voter casting a 23 ballot in a presidential preference primary or general election, 24 your vote-by-mail ballot must be postmarked or dated no later 25 than the date of the election and received by the supervisor of 26 elections of the county in which you are registered to vote no 27 later than 10 days after the date of the election. Note that the 28 later you return your ballot, the less time you will have to 29 cure any signature deficiencies, which is authorized until 5 30 p.m. on the 2nd day after the election.

 Mark your ballot in secret as instructed on the ballot.
You must mark your own ballot unless you are unable to do so because of blindness, disability, or inability to read or write.

3. Mark only the number of candidates or issue choices for a race as indicated on the ballot. If you are allowed to "Vote for One" candidate and you vote for more than one candidate, your vote in that race will not be counted.

5. Insert the secrecy envelope into the enclosed mailing

42 6. Seal the mailing envelope and completely fill out the43 Voter's Certificate on the back of the mailing envelope.

44 7. VERY IMPORTANT. In order for your vote-by-mail ballot to be counted, you must sign your name on the line above (Voter's 45 Signature). A vote-by-mail ballot will be considered illegal and 46 47 not be counted if the signature on the voter's certificate does not match the signature on record. The signature on file at the 48 49 time the supervisor of elections in the county in which your 50 precinct is located receives your vote-by-mail ballot is the 51 signature that will be used to verify your signature on the voter's certificate. If you need to update your signature for 52 53 this election, send your signature update on a voter 54 registration application to your supervisor of elections so that 55 it is received before your vote-by-mail ballot is received.

8. VERY IMPORTANT. If you are an overseas voter, you must include the date you signed the Voter's Certificate on the line above (Date) or your ballot may not be counted.

9. Mail, deliver, or have delivered the completed mailing envelope. Be sure there is sufficient postage if mailed. THE COMPLETED MAILING ENVELOPE CAN BE DELIVERED TO THE OFFICE OF THE SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS OF THE COUNTY IN WHICH YOUR PRECINCT IS LOCATED OR DROPPED OFF AT AN AUTHORIZED SECURE DROP BOX, AVAILABLE AT EACH EARLY VOTING LOCATION.

65 10. FELONY NOTICE. It is a felony under Florida law to 66 accept any gift, payment, or gratuity in exchange for your vote 67 for a candidate. It is also a felony under Florida law to vote 68 in an election using a false identity or false address, or under 69 any other circumstances making your ballot false or fraudulent.
