15	Section 1. Section 366.032, Florida Statutes, is created
16	to read:
17	366.032 Definition; preemption over utility service
18	restrictions
19	(1) As used in this section, the term "utility service
20	provider" means any person, any corporation, whether public or
21	private, any partnership, any association, or any political
22	subdivision, whether a municipality, county, special district,
23	or other political subdivision that sells or supplies
24	electricity or gas to the public within this state.
25	(2) A municipality, county, special district, or other

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26	political subdivision of the state may not enact or enforce a
27	resolution, ordinance, rule, code, policy, or take any action
28	that restricts or prohibits or has the effect of restricting or
29	prohibiting a property owner, tenant, or utility service
30	customer from selecting his or her utility service, whether
31	electric, manufactured gas, liquefied petroleum gas, natural
32	gas, hydrogen, fuel oil, a renewable source, or any other source
33	from a utility service provider that serves the affected
34	property. However, nothing in this section restricts a
35	municipality the right and power to levy taxes on public
36	services under s. 166.231 or affect the right of any
37	municipality to receive revenue from any public utility.
38	Section 2. Any municipality, county, special district, or
39	political subdivision charter, resolution, ordinance, rule,
40	code, policy, or action that is preempted by this act that
41	existed before or on July 1, 2021, is void.
42	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021.
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
