(c)1. Has had at least 2 years of clinical experience in mental health counseling, which must be at the post-master's level under the supervision of a licensed mental health counselor or the equivalent who is a qualified supervisor as determined by the board. An individual who intends to practice in Florida to satisfy the clinical experience requirements must register pursuant to s. 491.0045 before commencing practice. If a graduate has a master's degree with a major related to the practice of mental health counseling which did not include all the coursework required under sub-subparagraphs (b) 1.a. and b., credit for the post-master's level clinical experience may not commence until the applicant has completed a minimum of seven of the courses required under sub-subparagraphs (b) 1.a. and b., as determined by the board, one of which must be a course in psychopathology or abnormal psychology. A doctoral internship may be applied toward the clinical experience requirement. A licensed mental health professional must be on the premises when clinical services are provided by a registered intern in a private practice setting.

2. For the purpose of this paragraph, "supervision" means responsible supervision and control. Except in cases of emergency, such supervision requires the accessibility or physical presence of the qualified supervisor for consultation and direction of the actions of the mental health counseling intern. For the purposes of this definition, the term

"accessibility" includes the ability to communicate by way of telecommunication.

Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 916.115, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

916.115 Appointment of experts.-

- (1) The court shall appoint <u>up to</u> no more than three experts to determine the mental condition of a defendant in a criminal case, including competency to proceed, insanity, involuntary placement, and treatment. The experts may evaluate the defendant in jail or in another appropriate local facility or in a facility of the Department of Corrections.
- (a) To the extent possible, the appointed experts shall have completed forensic evaluator training approved by the department, and each shall be a psychiatrist or a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459, licensed a psychologist licensed under chapter 490, or a mental health professional licensed under chapter 491 physician.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021.
