30 (4) (4) (3) Each investigation shall be conducted by a multiagency team of at least five professionals with expertise 31 32 in child protection, child welfare, and organizational 33 management. The team may consist of employees of the department, community-based care lead agencies, Children's Medical Services, 34 35 and community-based care provider organizations; faculty from 36 the institute consisting of public and private universities 37 offering degrees in social work established pursuant to s. 38 1004.615; or any other person with the required expertise. The 39 team shall include, at a minimum, a Child Protection Team medical director, a representative from a child advocacy center 40
