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**Amendment**

Remove lines 900-903 and insert:

(c) After the department has notified a business in writing of an alleged violation, the department may in its discretion grant the business a 30-day period to cure the alleged violation. The department may consider the number of violations, the substantial likelihood of injury to the public, or the safety of persons or property when determining whether to grant 30 days to cure. If the business cures the alleged violation to the satisfaction of the department and provides proof to the department, the department may issue a letter of guidance to the business that indicates that the business will

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17 not be offered a 30-day cure period for any future violations.  
18 If the business fails to cure the violation to the satisfaction  
19 of the department within 30 days, the department may bring an  
20 action against the business for the alleged violation.

21 (d) This subsection shall not affect the private right of  
22 action provided in subsection (12).

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
