13	grant 30 days to cure. If the business cures the alleged
14	violation to the satisfaction of the department and provides
15	proof to the department, the department may issue a letter of
16	guidance to the business that indicates that the business will
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17	not be offered a 30-day cure period for any future violations.
18	If the business fails to cure the violation to the satisfaction
19	of the department within 30 days, the department may bring an
20	action against the business for the alleged violation.
