2           An act relating to pediatric cardiopulmonary  
3           resuscitation; creating s. 383.147, F.S.; requiring  
4           the Department of Health to develop and annually  
5           update educational materials relating to pediatric  
6           cardiopulmonary resuscitation; providing requirements  
7           for such materials; requiring the department to post  
8           the materials on its website in a specified format;  
9           requiring hospitals, birth centers, and other state-  
10          licensed birthing facilities to provide the  
11          educational materials to parents of newborns before  
12          they are discharged; requiring such entities to post a  
13          link to such materials on their websites, if any;  
14          providing that attending health care providers at home  
15          births are responsible for providing the educational  
16          materials to the parents within a specified timeframe;  
17          amending s. 383.2163, F.S.; revising the list of  
18          telehealth services and education that may be provided  
19          under the telehealth minority maternity care pilot  
20          programs to include education on pediatric  
21          cardiopulmonary resuscitation; amending ss. 383.311  
22          and 383.318, F.S.; requiring birth centers to educate  
23          their clients in pediatric cardiopulmonary  
24          resuscitation before and after each birth; amending s.  
25          395.1053, F.S.; requiring hospitals to provide the

26 department-developed educational materials on  
 27 pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation as part of  
 28 their postpartum instruction on the care of newborns;  
 29 providing an effective date.

31 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

 33 Section 1. Section 383.147, Florida Statutes, is created  
 34 to read:

35 383.147 Pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation  
 36 education.-

37 (1) The Department of Health shall develop and annually  
 38 update educational materials relating to pediatric  
 39 cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The materials must reflect the  
 40 most current accepted medical standards and guidelines for  
 41 pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation and must include, at a  
 42 minimum, all of the following:

43 (a) An explanation of pediatric cardiopulmonary  
 44 resuscitation, noting the differences between cardiopulmonary  
 45 resuscitation for adults, infants, and children.

46 (b) Examples of situations and risk factors that may  
 47 increase the incidence of respiratory or cardiac emergencies in  
 48 infants and children.

49 (c) Information on the importance of families receiving  
 50 training in pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

51 (d) Links to certified training courses for pediatric  
52 cardiopulmonary resuscitation and other resources available to  
53 families for the promotion of infant and child safety.

54 (e) Any other information the department deems appropriate  
55 for the promotion of infant and child safety.

56 (2) The Department of Health shall post the educational  
57 materials on its website in an easily accessible format,  
58 ensuring that any links contained therein are active.

59 (3) Each hospital, birth center, or other state-licensed  
60 birthing facility that provides maternity and newborn care  
61 services shall, before a newborn is discharged, provide the  
62 parents of each newborn with the educational materials on  
63 pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation developed by the  
64 Department of Health under subsection (1). Each hospital, birth  
65 center, and other state-licensed birthing facility shall also  
66 make available on its website, if any, a link to the educational  
67 materials on the Department of Health's website.

68 (4) For home births, the attending health care provider is  
69 responsible for providing the educational materials to parents  
70 within 24 hours after a birth.

71 Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section  
72 383.2163, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

73 383.2163 Telehealth minority maternity care pilot  
74 programs.—By July 1, 2022, the department shall establish a  
75 telehealth minority maternity care pilot program in Duval County

76 | and Orange County which uses telehealth to expand the capacity  
 77 | for positive maternal health outcomes in racial and ethnic  
 78 | minority populations. The department shall direct and assist the  
 79 | county health departments in Duval County and Orange County to  
 80 | implement the programs.

81 | (3) TELEHEALTH SERVICES AND EDUCATION.—The pilot programs  
 82 | shall adopt the use of telehealth or coordinate with prenatal  
 83 | home visiting programs to provide all of the following services  
 84 | and education to eligible pregnant women up to the last day of  
 85 | their postpartum periods, as applicable:

86 | (b) Services and education addressing social determinants  
 87 | of health, including, but not limited to, all of the following:

- 88 | 1. Housing placement options.
- 89 | 2. Transportation services or information on how to access  
 90 | such services.
- 91 | 3. Nutrition counseling.
- 92 | 4. Access to healthy foods.
- 93 | 5. Lactation support.
- 94 | 6. Lead abatement and other efforts to improve air and  
 95 | water quality.
- 96 | 7. Child care options.
- 97 | 8. Car seat installation and training.
- 98 | 9. Pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation, including  
 99 | provision of the educational materials developed by the  
 100 | department under s. 383.147(1).

101        10. Wellness and stress management programs.  
 102        ~~11.10.~~ Coordination across safety net and social support  
 103 services and programs.

104        Section 3. Paragraph (g) is added to subsection (2) of  
 105 section 383.311, Florida Statutes, to read:

106        383.311 Education and orientation for birth center clients  
 107 and their families.—

108        (2) The clients shall be prepared for childbirth and  
 109 childbearing by education in:

110        (g) Pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation, including  
 111 provision of the educational materials developed by the  
 112 Department of Health under s. 383.147(1).

113        Section 4. Paragraph (j) is added to subsection (3) of  
 114 section 383.318, Florida Statutes, to read:

115        383.318 Postpartum care for birth center clients and  
 116 infants.—

117        (3) The birth center shall provide a postpartum evaluation  
 118 and follow-up care that includes all of the following:

119        (j) Instruction on pediatric cardiopulmonary  
 120 resuscitation, including provision of the educational materials  
 121 developed by the Department of Health under s. 383.147(1).

122        Section 5. Section 395.1053, Florida Statutes, is amended  
 123 to read:

124        395.1053 Postpartum education.—A hospital that provides  
 125 birthing services shall incorporate information on safe sleep
