An act relating to regulation of compounded drug products; providing legislative intent; requiring the Surgeon General, on behalf of the Department of Health, to sign and become a party to the United States Food and Drug Administration's Memorandum of Understanding Addressing Certain Distributions of Compounded Human Drug Products; requiring the Surgeon General to notify the Division of Law Revision within a specified timeframe after signing the memorandum; creating s. 465.036, F.S.; requiring certain pharmacy permittees to annually report information to the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy's information sharing network as required by the memorandum; requiring the department to ensure such permittees comply with the reporting requirements; providing effective dates.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. (1) It is the intent of the Legislature to enhance communication and maximize federal and state resources for the oversight of compounded drug products produced and shipped by pharmacies in this state, and to enact an information sharing agreement with the United States Food and Drug Administration for the purpose of monitoring compounded drug products produced in this state which are shipped outside of this state.

(2) Upon release of the United States Food and Drug

Administration's Memorandum of Understanding Addressing Certain Distributions of Compounded Human Drug Products, as provided for in section 503A(b)(3)(B)(i) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act, 21 U.S.C. s. 353a, the Surgeon General, on behalf of the Department of Health, shall sign and become a party to the memorandum. The Surgeon General must notify the Division of Law Revision within 5 days after signing the memorandum.

Section 2. Effective upon the date the Surgeon General signs the United States Food and Drug Administration's Memorandum of Understanding Addressing Certain Distributions of Compounded Human Drug Products, section 465.036, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

465.036 Annual reporting on shipments of compounded drug products.—By April 1 of each year, permittees that ship compounded drug products to another state shall report information to the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy's information sharing network as required by the Memorandum of Understanding Addressing Certain Distributions of Compounded Human Drug Products between the department and the United States Food and Drug Administration. The department shall ensure that permittees comply with this section.

Section 3. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
